New Adult Education Podcasts by Jeff Taylor

Below is a screenshot of the curriculum for Taylorsville UMCs Adult Education website. The are now 83 podcasts on the site. The site itself has over 6 GB of information.

Our SS class is started on a study of second Isaiah this past Tuesday night at 7 PM on Zoom. We will then continue the study on Sunday mornings. We meet in the Education Building at 8:50a.m. All are welcome to come join us.

Each podcast is associated with additional reference information such as topic summaries, essays, and frequently asked questions. All is original material not copied from any source.

The Curriculum: (Total 83 Podcasts)

- The Jewish Temple: Theology, Mysticism, and The Kingdom of God (18 Podcasts)
- The Early Worship of Jesus (17 Podcasts)
- James The Brother of Jesus (12 Podcasts)
- The Nature of Reality, Is There A Place For God? (15 Podcasts)
- Does Modern Science Support A Spiritual Worldview? (8 Podcasts)
- The Mind of GOD (4 Podcasts, More To Come)
- A History and Interpretation of Second Isaiah (7 Podcasts)
- More To Come)

Each class is centered around a podcast (average of 30 minutes) with additional support material. Each class has a cited reference source for people who want more information. I have personally curated every source for academic accuracy and appropriateness.

Since I have not used any original material from the sources, no copyrights are violated and all sources used are cited just like any academic publication.

I can't imagine many other churches have free study material of this caliber and depth. I have used only the most current and respected resources from academia. In addition, many classes provide different points of view for controversial topics.

The podcast dialogues are lively, entertaining, and very understandable.

After looking at the Old Testament system of sacrifices and then at the significance of Jesus' sacrifice we now look at the unique relationship between the sanctuary and offerings or sacrifices. King David's choices led him to bear responsibility for his sin. An angel of the Lord spoke through the prophet Gad and told David to "build an altar to the Lord on the threshing floor of Araunah the Jebusite". David refused to accept a gift from Araunah for a sacrifice because David would not "sacrifice a burnt offering that costs...... nothing".

Next we consider the dedication of Solomon's temple and the lavish sacrifices that took place as a part of that ceremony. However, after the people were exiled to Babylon, that temple was left in shambles. The foundation of a new temple would need to be laid by the people who had returned from exile. When the foundation of that temple was laid, the people celebrated the goodness of God, proclaiming that "his love endures forever". We then look at the people's covenant renewal and their pledge to observe the commands of the Law of Moses and reject the abuse and neglect of the house of God.

We meet in the social room on Sunday mornings at 9. We invite you to join us.



At our April 24th meeting we welcomed volunteers Julia Manolios and Bob Paddock from the Mount Airy Net. They gave a very informative presentation.

The organization was started in 1993 by area pastors. The

organization is 100% community-based, they do not receive funds from any federal or state programs.



They provided some statistics; in 2023 they saw 220 guests per month. In 2024 they saw approximately 164 guests per month. Currently, they see 164 to approximately 180 per month. One guest generally has 3 to 5 people in their household. They can come monthly for food. There are approximately 12 new guests per year. The services they offer are food, rental assistance, utility, medical assistance, and the unsheltered.

This program serves residents of Mount Airy only; they require proof of residency.

They would give a one-time donation of food to non-Mount Airy residents. They would provide a list of county resources to those in need of services that live in other locations. This service is for those who need help. They do not ask about finances or job status.

The Net has two paid employees, and many volunteers. Their hours of operation are four hours a day, 10 AM to 2 PM, Tuesday, Wednesdays, and Thursdays.

Each month they prepare a standard list of staples that are distributed to each guest. Other items that guests may receive are pet food, baking items, condiments, tea, coffee, baked goods, produce. They also give Food Lion gift cards as needed. They assist with fuel or utility bills once a year for those needing help with that. They do require that the person bring the bill and they will pay it directly.

90% of the food is donated; if they run low on staples, the Net purchases items they need at a local grocery store. They receive donations from the community, local churches, some stores, and farmers in the area bring an abundance of produce during the summer.

The Net does have compliance audits conducted by an outside paid accountant.

Future plans include a resilience center, that was briefly mentioned, but that is several years down the road and still in the planning stages. The Net is also raising funds for a trailer that can be taken to events.

The women attending the meeting, brought donations of food, diapers, and other items to the meeting.

The Net expressed much gratitude for the support of Taylorsville Church, and for the community support they receive.






