Martin Luther King has been quoted many times on his opinions of ignorance: "Nothing in the world is more dangerous than sincere ignorance and conscientious stupidity." This educational experience focuses on how our intentional effort to expand our knowledge base, can positively impact our life in many ways.

HOPE: Rite of Passage for Sons and Daughters

This event is designed to offer a hopeful perspective for a better future-vision of the social aspects you share with your child. This is not a clinical environment, but a look at social and interpersonal communities that are part of the cultural fabric in our lives. This will include a look at many of the challenges and encourages new successes.

Take Back Your Future - "Stealthfully damaged": The new slavery

The goal and objective of this event is to lead a hopeful process of contextual learning that will transform communities and inspire personal social growth. The hope of this experience is to make communities aware that a broader and more well-rounded understanding of culture has so much to do with success.
