It was also so delightful to finally meet – in person – our 2022 Amka Cohort! The eight young women in the program have grown so much over the course of the last year, and we are excited to see where they go as they journey on to the next stage of their lives.

We also made good use of the "time on the ground," to launch our Pads with a Purpose efforts for 2023 – reaching over 600 girls in the span of just four weeks!

A key takeaway from the overall visit is this – the work of To Africa with Love, NFP still matters; it still has impact. Our mission to connect, care and contribute to the people of Kenya is still important.

Our Impact: 2022 - 2023



5 Acts of Love were performed in 2022 and **3** thus far in 2023. These have included money to start a business, a school uniform, sports equipment for a children's home, food and supplies to support families of disabled children, and more.



500 girls were reached through Pads with a Purpose in 2022, and over **600** have been reached thus far in 2023. Since 2017, we have now reached **5,945** young lives, spreading the message that their lives have purpose.



A first Amka Cohort of 5 graduated in 2020. A second Amka Cohort of 8 started in 2022 and graduated in February, 2023. We are planning for a **third Amka Cohort** to start in November, 2023.
