

Brief Bio of Pastor Gail Duba

I'd like to take a few minutes to introduce myself. I am a third career pastor, with teaching H.S. biology as my first career. After 2 years, I returned to school for a Masters in Forestry from Colorado State University, with forestry management being my second career. Although not the typical route to ordained ministry, it is not totally unheard of either. It has seemed to me like during the 16 years since I was ordained in 2002, I have used skills learned from both teaching and forestry for sermon illustrations and in my ability to relate to most people in the church. Now that I will be the interim for your rural farming congregations, I hope you'll be able to see how growing trees is just a slower process than growing farm crops!

I was born in Denver, CO, the fourth of five children, of Joanne and Don Young, both fine, loving, Christian parents. I am grateful that I had to opportunity to grow up in a small town in S. Colorado, Canon City, from age 3 until I went to college at Valparaiso University, IN. My Dad had gotten one of the first 4 jobs with the Colorado State Forest Service. My Mom was a Jr. High English teacher. After I completed my B.S. I taught for two years in the former mining town of Cripple Creek, CO, only about 45 miles from my hometown.

I met my husband, David, when I was in my first year of forestry school. He was working at his first job as an ecologist and we met at an organization that my advisor had started--Christian Foresters Fellowship. That chance meeting was to chart the rest of our lives as we met, fell in love, David took a job in Saudi Arabia, we got married, and both lived in S.A. for 2 years. We traveled to many places during those years for both work and fun--including Egypt, Tanzania, Kenya, Europe, India, Nepal, Burma, Thailand, and Hong Kong. I flew home after 4 month of travel to resume my forestry degree while David continued traveling to S. Korea, Japan, and Taiwan. While I returned to my studies, David found an ecology job in Boise. We moved to Boise and I finished my forestry at U. of Idaho and worked near Boise for both the USFS and the ID Dept. of Lands. We decided to start a family and our oldest son, Jason, was born in Boise in 1982. When Jason was 2, David made the major decision to go to medical school, was accepted and began on his 34th birthday at the UW School of Medicine. Kyle was born in 1985 and Forrest in 1988. I made the decision to follow God's leading and went to Pacific Lutheran Theological School completing my studies and being ordained in 2002.

We have the great delight of having Jason marry Mary Emily Briehl Wells in July of 2007. They now are the proud parents of our granddaughter, Abigail who they call Abby. Mary Emily is a theologian, obtained her M. Div. and then just finished her 5 year program to obtain her PhD. They now live in Dubuque, IA, where she is a professor at the U. of Dubuque School of Theology and Jason got a job with the city planning department. Kyle lives in Lander, WY, doing freelance videography and photography. Forrest is between jobs having taken some time off to decide what his true calling is. He is a WSU grad and very proud to be a Coug! I have served four congregations and retired from ministry in June of this year, knowing there were many other aspects of life I wanted to explore. When I was offered the interim position at Peace and Trinity, however, I readily decided to return to ministry as *God isn't finished with me yet!*
