The Birth of Jesus--Little Things Mean a Lot

From the book of John we read, "And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth." John 1:14

We love the calm, cosmic view of the Word becoming flesh given to us by John's mystic vision. Yes, we also cherish the details of the birth of the baby Jesus in the manger and hold close the words which Luke shares of Jesus' birth: "In those days a decree went out from the Emperor Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered...Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth and laid him in the manger, because there was no room for them in the inn." Luke 21:1-7. We need both versions to tell the story completely--the divinity and the humanity of Jesus.

The grace of God was delivered to earth in the package of a tiny, squirmy baby boy. He was a child, yet he split open time and began a journey to the cross where death was defeated once and for all. The strain, haste and worry in the very human story of Jesus' birth reminds us of our own human lives. It is a story that draws us in irresistibly even as we are drawn into all the many ways that we create to celebrate this Holy Birth.

This is why in the Lutheran tradition, we make a very concerted effort to practice the season of Advent, a time of reflection and quietude. Advent season is the four Sundays leading up to Christmas Eve. During the season of Advent we sing the familiar "Light One Candle to Watch for Messiah," increasing the number of verses each week. We will light the candles on the Advent wreath each week, reminding us of the reason we are anticipating the birth of our Messiah and Lord. Remember the pins we have worn? "Jesus is the Reason for the Season."

Each Sunday of Advent we will emphasize a different way of remembering how blessed we are in the birth of the Christ Child.

Some highlights of Advent will be on December 9, our pianist at Peace, Raul Blanco, will be presenting a concert with his Cuban jazz band at 1 p.m. Come and support this excellent WSU student by listening to the concert and then maybe purchasing a CD his band has recorded. On December 24, we will continue the tradition of having our Christmas Eve services at 5:00 at Trinity in Endicott and then 7:00 p.m. at Peace Lutheran in Colfax. Come and celebrate the birth of the Christ Child in our midst.

In January, the service times will switch. The 9:00 a.m. service will be at Trinity in Endicott and the 11:00 will be at Peace in Colfax. This is being done to accommodate Pastor Gail who will be staying most Saturdays at the parsonage in Endicott. Hopefully this will not disrupt anyone's schedule too much.
