Don & Debi have been instrumental in the formation of "Maasai Health Systems" which is a fundraising organization for the medical operation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania based in Arusha, Tanzania. Maasai Health Systems has raised money for special projects like buying a bus to bring patients to the hospital. They bought an ambulance and have helped improve the outlying health clinics. They raised the funds for a new generator to help with the inconsistent electricity that comes to the hospital. The current project is raising funds to modernize the hospital laundry. They will have a slide presentation on their recent time in Tanzania. Their presentation will take place at the end of church, from 12 to 1:15. African Soup will be served.

Don and Debi's presentation will be followed at 1:30 p.m. by the Jazz Concert by our pianist, **Raul Blanco's band**. This will be a day you will not want to miss!

"At the Center"

In 1998, I was accepted to seminary at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in Berkeley, CA. I was ordained on December 22, 2002, the same year I turned 50. What happened to me in those years is difficult to explain and it is really challenging to even come up with words to describe my gradual transition from teacher and forester to Pastor Gail. This gradual transition, this transformation, this change in the way I viewed all of life is called *pastoral formation*. It happens differently to all people in seminary, but no one comes out in the same way they began. That's just a brief explanation of *pastoral formation*. Something that did not change, is my habit of clipping out interesting articles. Sure enough in April, 1999, I clipped out an article by Rev. Walt Wangerin, Jr., from the Lutheran Vespers. It is so impactful that I'd like to quote a portion of it for you. It is as relevant today as when this fine Lutheran pastor wrote it.

"At the center of Easter is Jesus. At the center of the Christian church there can be nothing but Christ.

At the center of any true and durable human justice--as it's source and its purity--must

be the love of God made manifest in the Lord Jesus Christ.

At the center of our faith: Jesus.

At the center of our lives: Christ.

At the center of Scripture: Jesus.

At the center of the fullness of divine revelation is Jesus.

If a church presents anything besides Jesus as its primary preachment, its defining and offering to the world, that church is no longer Christian. ... Entertainment doesn't require a church. Moreover, it mitigates against the centrality of Christ by making the audience central.

In my traveling I have heard sermons in which Jesus is not the central message: we are! Our niceness is. Or the necessity of justice is. Jesus is sometimes shanghaied to support what the preachers choose as greater truths. Neither are churches which have become a monument to human achievement. And at the core of all this is not the cross, neither the humility of Jesus, not the humility of those who live at the foot of the cross. Easy, so easy, to neglect our Lord.

But at the center of all we do: **Jesus** . The center of our every act; the motive for all our relationships; the delight in which we rise of a morning; the peace we enter every night: Jesus. The Lord Jesus. The Lord Jesus Christ. Him Alone.

Let Easter be more than a day.

Let Easter define our lives together.. Alleluia."
