Greetings, dearly beloved. Grace to you and peace from God and from our Lord Jesus Christ. February has been a challenging month with the most snowfall in a single February since 1937 or so. This *could* be good news for the farmers or it *could be not so good*, depending on whether the snow cover stays or blows away. The challenging part of farming is they won't know until the snow melts and they can see if the winter wheat has germinated or if they need to plow it under and begin with spring wheat.

The "less than good news" is that the snow hampered some planned events. David and I drove down to the parsonage on Saturday evening, February 9, so we wouldn't have to drive down on bad roads. The wind was blowing that night. David got up one time and saw that the flag at Greg's house across the street was flying straight out with blowing snow. That morning we had our church service at Endicott. Chris headed out for church at Colfax and came back with the news that the roads were impossible to see due to the blowing and drifting snow. We called Peace to let them know we could not make it. The Annual Budget meeting was held. The budget passed. Bishop Kristen had also cancelled her first meeting with the call committee due to the roads. The meeting was rescheduled for Thursday, Feb. 21, to be done with a conference call.

You all know the saying, "March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb." I am hoping that for all of our sakes! This year March holds many important liturgical days. Sunday, March 3, is the Sunday of the Transfiguration of our Lord. From Matthew 17: *Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John up a high mountain, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. While Jesus was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and a voice said, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him."*

That day on the mountaintop the disciples saw Jesus "in a new light." This sudden insight into who Jesus was and what his life on earth meant, challenged both the disciples--and all of us who are following Jesus. When we see Jesus in the "new light," we are both astonished and terrified. How can we serve Jesus, we ask ourselves. How can we know what Jesus would have us do? How can we be Jesus' true disciples in our world? God's grace gives us courage to step fully into the new light that Jesus brings into the world. Change can be frightening, but we can trust that God will guide us and that we will be Christ's light for the world. On March 6, we will have our combined Ash Wednesday service at Trinity with a community soup supper beginning at 6 p.m. The imposition of the Ashes begins our 40 day journey through Lent. I encourage all who are able to attend the service at Trinity to begin our Lenten journey with Christ.
