Pastor's Message

Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

--Philippians 4:6-7

Dear Members of Peace and Trinity,

As we welcome the month of June, we find ourselves stepping into the warmth of summer, a season often filled with change, renewal, and growth. Whether it's a shift in our daily routines, a break from school or work, or even the blooming of new opportunities in our lives, June offers a moment to reflect on transitions and the ways in which God is at work in our lives.

For many, summer is a time of change, family vacations, youth sports camps, or time spent in reflection and rest. For others it is a time to gear up for the harvest ahead. Life is about to get busy! These transitions, whether big or small, remind us that we are always in a state of becoming, always moving forward into the future God has planned for us. While we do not often, as humans, crave change, we also recognize that this state of becoming, this state of change, has the potential to make us more who God has called us to be in the world.

However, this transformation does not happen without prayer. Whether it is prayers for calmness as change envelopes us, or prayers of thanksgiving for the shifting seasons of the world, and our lives, as Christians we understand the importance of the connection that comes with prayer.

This June, as we celebrate the beauty and opportunities that the summer season brings, we are reminded that prayer is a tool of both comfort and guidance. Through prayer, we can lean into God's presence, seeking God's direction for the changes ahead. It is through prayer that we find the strength to move forward with faith, knowing that God is with us every step of the way.

As we enjoy the warmth and relaxation of this season, let us remember that prayer is not only a means of seeking comfort during times of change, but also a way to thank God for the blessings and opportunities God brings. By approaching each new transition with gratitude and prayer, we

invite God's peace to flow over us and through us, allowing us to embrace the future with confidence and trust.

In this month of June, let us commit to bringing every situation to God in prayer, remembering that God's peace will guard our hearts and minds. As we experience the joys and challenges of this season, may we find comfort in knowing that God is guiding us and renewing us every day.
