Pastor's Message

Hebrews 10:24-25 And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

Dear Siblings in Christ,

I have always loved these verses from Hebrews because they are such a stark reminder that we need one another. We cannot do this alone. The Christian faith was not meant to be lived alone. It was not meant to be simply a movement "between me and Jesus," but rather a movement that changes how we live in community with another. This has become especially clear during this pandemic, when we have had to find different ways of meeting with one another. While I am sure the writer of Hebrews meant meeting together in-person, I am also proud to say we have met together in many different ways this year. While it hasn't been perfect, it has been meaningful. Whether we met on Zoom, outside or socially distanced inside of the building, it is very clear that "meet together" took on a whole different meaning this year than anyone intended.

With community in mind, I wanted to take this chance to invite you to our Lenten series, "Created for Community." Our midweek services this year will be a series of interactive worship services where we will explore together what it means to worship our God

together as the people of God. We will connect with the text through different mindfulness practices. We will take some time to write, draw and talk during our services so that we might learn more about each other. We will explore nature and our place in it. We will seek out the marginalized and listen to God's calling as we continue new ways of service. It will be meaningful and almost as importantly, I think it will also be fun!

Additionally, we will be meeting before the midweek service each week for 30 minutes to do a quick study of the Gospels. How are they different from one another? How are they the same? How did the authors compose the various books? Who wrote them? How do we know? Each Wednesday we will explore a different Gospel. In the short amount of time, it is only meant as a quick primer, that can conveniently take the place of our normal potluck this year. Hopefully, the potluck can resume next year! However, I am grateful this year for the chance to try something new! Also, if the group decides we need more than 30 minutes, we can discuss meeting even earlier in the evening! We can certainly adjust as needed.

The Bible study will begin each Wednesday at 7PM starting on February 24th. The service will then begin at 7:30PM. Please feel free to come to one, the other, or both! THESE SERVICES WILL TAKE PLACE ON ZOOM, NOT NECESSARILY AS A SAFETY PRECAUTION, BUT RATHER IN THE HOPE THAT MANY OF YOU WILL BE ABLE TO JOIN US FOR AN HOUR, EVEN IN THE MIDST OF YOUR HECTIC LIVES.. Zoom links will be sent out the week before.

On a related note, I invite you to our **in-person** Ash Wednesday service at 7PM, February 17th at Trinity, Endicott. This will be a combined service. There will be no Bible study on this Wednesday. Holy Week plans will be released as Easter nears.

As Hebrews reminds us, we are community. Let's take this Lenten journey of repentance together as we journey towards the Alleluias of Easter. Let's get to know others in new ways and perhaps more difficult, let's invite others to get to know us in new ways as well. Let's learn something new! This last year has taken close physical proximity out of the picture for many of us. It is not fun. However, I'd encourage us to recognize that God does not call us here to be community because we are physically close, but because we are connected to each other through Christ. May these midweek services and our journey

through Lent show us the expansive beauty of togetherness for the sake of Christ. Come and see! It will be good!
