

Pastor's Message

The Eighth Commandment

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Many of you may remember Luther's explanation of the eighth commandment from your Confirmation days. Maybe you even keep a copy of the Small Catechism on the bookshelf and pull it out every once in a while. Either way, this is one of my favorite portions of Luther's writing and it is also, by far, one of the most difficult to truly follow. Not telling lies about our neighbors? Seems easy enough. Don't make stuff up about them? Also easy. Hurt their reputation? OK, I won't do that. But then the flipside comes. Not only should I not lie about my neighbors, I should defend them? That's harder. Speaking well of them? Sometimes harder and sometimes easier, I'll admit. But the one that always gets me, not only should I be nice to my neighbors and defend them from people who may wish them harm, but I should interpret everything that they do in the kindest way possible. Especially in a divided world, that seems like an almost insurmountable task. It is so easy to simply assume that the actions or words of another are meant to wish us harm. It is so easy for our first thoughts to be against the neighbor and not interpreted in the best light.

At no place, that I can think of, is this more clear in our world today than with politics. Republicans seem to think Democrats have it out for them. Democrats seem to think that Republicans are ruining the country. But what would it mean to interpret the actions of the other in the best possible light?

What would it mean to assume, that until proven otherwise, our neighbors really do have our best interests at heart? This is not meant to give everyone a free pass, but rather it seems Luther suggests it is important to not make people into enemies because of what we *think* they might mean by their words or actions. Even then, we know what Jesus says about our enemies (Matthew 5:44). In other words, what does it mean to work together for the common good?

If you were looking for answers to these questions, I don't have them! What I do have is an invitation! This summer, Peace will be hosting some space for difficult conversations to take place. On the second Sunday of each month we will meet for guided discussion on these topics. On June 13th we will meet at 8AM at Peace (early, I know, but well worth it!) On July 11th and August 8th, due to the worship service time switch, we will meet directly after Peace's 11AM worship service. These discussions will last no longer than 45 minutes.

Just as a small taste, the first class in June will cover the topic, "Who should Christians vote for?" There will be a short presentation, a video and then a short time for discussion. Hint: I am not going to tell you how to vote and no one else will either. Please come ready to question, learn, discuss and grow. Please also make sure Luther's explanation is (at least metaphorically) in your back pocket. These conversations are challenging, but I think they are a part of who God calls us to be in the world and I am excited to have the opportunity to discuss things with you!

Annual Meeting Minutes

May 23, 2021

The annual congregational meeting was held immediately following the 9:00am service.

President Kent Miller opened the meeting and Pastor Ian McMichael led in prayer.

Approval of Minutes

Kent directed the congregation members to review the published minutes on pages 15-17 of the annual report booklet. Marvin Wigen moved to approve the minutes as printed and Steve Teade seconded; motion passed.

Kent called for nominations to be voted on in one ballot. Following the counting of ballots by Pete Wigen and Kent, it was announced members voted unanimously in favor of the nominees.

Kent thanked our newest council members for their willingness to serve in these new roles.

<u>Updates</u>

Pastor Ian offered the following updates:

- 1- The entry and gathering area of the church is currently being freshened up. The council has allotted funds for this purpose and a committee of volunteers are compiling ideas for the space including painting 2 walls, purchasing new furniture and updating the wall space with welcoming signs.
- 2- Discussions are underway for hiring a Faith Formation Director who will serve in the area of education and leadership for all ages. This position is funded by the capitol campaign. A committee has been formed and will begin reviewing the job description with the council, with advertising the position as the next step.

Final Vote on Constitution

Kent directed the congregation to review the ratified constitution as it was previously adopted for a final vote. Georgie Leinweber moved to accept and adopt the constitution as written and Catherine Olson seconded; motion passed.

Open Floor and Closing of the Meeting

Kent opened the floor for general business; no new business was mentioned.

Kent adjourned the meeting and closed with everyone joining him in The Lords Prayer.
