Semper Reformanda-Always Reforming

It is that time of year! Yes, that time of year! I am talking about the time of year for Pumpkin Spice Lattes, sweaters, cool mornings and, hopefully, a sense that the busy fall rush has fallen quieter and is now simply a routine. Full confession, Starbucks re-released their Pumpkin Spice Latte at the end of August and although I waited awhile, I did not make it until October before I ordered it.

However, all of that really just sets the scene for why I am writing this today. At the end of this month we will celebrate Reformation Day! A day that has very little to do with seasonal drinks, sweatpants and car heaters turning back on, but a day that the church holds as celebration for the work of the Reformation in the world still today. You may have also noticed that I have an additional small quote up at the top this time as well. *Semper Reformanda*. Always Reforming. There are varying views on what the Reformation means for the world today. Some think that Martin Luther had it all right. There is nothing more to reform. Others, and this is the stance the ELCA takes, proclaim that Luther was one, albeit very important, historical reformer who saw a need and worked to fix it. However, he did not have all the answers and we are tasked with continuing to seek reformation and renewal for ourselves, our neighbor, our church and the world. While we are not tasked with being Luther in the modern age, we are tasked as a church with seeing needs and fixing them in the name of Christ. Not for the sake of our salvation, but for the sake of the neighbor.

That's why I love the vision statements both from Peace and Trinity. Peace's states that the vision is to "Provide services for the diverse needs of the community by opening our doors and going out to the world. Compassionate, dynamic place where people want to gather." While Trinity's is equally as good! It states that the vision of Trinity is "To build up a strong Body of Christ through serving others with caring and compassion-giving-loving-faithfulness-welcoming and reaching out." I love these statements on their own. They speak to the particular mission that God has given each of Trinity and Peace during this specific time and place in the world. I love that both statements speak openly about serving the other. In the end, that's the call of Christ. As all of us know, this call isn't always easy. In fact, it very often is not easy, but our mission statements ground us and tell us who we have committed ourselves to be in the world through Christ and Christ's grace.

More than that though, in this Reformation season, I think these vision statements ground us in our tradition as Lutherans, in a lineage that goes back 500 years. With these visions and God as our guide, we become part of the big story of the Reformation, ready to continue reforming. We know that God's work is not done, that it will look different than it did 500 years ago and yet, that it will still involve the neighbor and those outside of the church walls. So church, let's keep up the commitment that we made to ourselves through these vision statements. Let's keep reforming for the sake of the church, the world and all of those in need. Let us push ourselves outside of comfort and seek God wherever we are. We are in good company!
