Dear Siblings in Christ,

There are indeed a lot of reasons to cry out to the world these days. The world is broken and hurting. We continue, as a Church and as a nation to deal with large structural issues. We seem to, in many respects, have lost the ability to talk with one another. In all of this, we know, more than anything that our God is a God of promise. There is, most importantly, the promise of eternal life, in which we ground our every action and reaction as a church. In addition to that promise of eternal life, and indeed inextricably linked to it, is the promise that our God will never forsake us.

There have been a lot of changes in the McMichaels' lives recently. There is ever more to come! In my life it is rare to see a manifestation of such a grand promise. How can one truly grasp the nature of a God who is so big, so powerful, so loving and so kind? A God who calls us to walk with God. A God who calls us to work with God.

During that time, she was still able to complete her Masters in Public Health and was excited about using that to improve community education, health and overall wellness. A temporary job popped up in Colfax and she jumped at the chance. She is now a temporary Environmental Health Specialist and started at the beginning of August. She also continues to work at Peace and make sure things are running smoothly there.

The timing is challenging, her being eight months pregnant and beginning a new job. It also means my schedule needed to shift to take Hans, or find someone who would, when she was at work. Whether you have noticed it or not, the last couple of months have been STRESSFUL as we try to navigate what this fulfillment of a promise means for us during this time. When the new addition arrives, there will be another phase of "trying to get things figured out."

I will be on parental leave for a large portion of the end of this year. I would give you specific dates, but they seem to keep changing depending on which family will be in town at which time. Depending on final travel plans and when Baby McMichael decides to make an appearance, I'll give council final word when things are solidified. Between vacation and parental leave, I will be gone somewhere in the range of seven weeks, as we bond as a family and try to figure out a new normal.

For now, I simply give thanks that the Lord is my helper, and that in many ways the Lord shows this through how many of you have helped me the last couple of months and those who will help me in the months ahead. I give thanks for a fulfilling vocation, both for Corrin and myself. I give thanks for grace extended and grace received. Sometimes, while this is certainly what we wanted, and a manifestation of God's goodness in the world, it is also stressful. So, I will end by saying thank you to all of you who have had to shift schedules and meeting with me to make this schedule work. Thank you for understanding the importance of vocation and parenthood, both mine and Corrin's. Thanks for being a great group of people with whom to walk God's mission. I look forward to spending time with Baby McMichael when she comes, and look forward to being back and continuing to share, and hear, the Good News.
