Pastor's Message

Psalm 23

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters; he restores my soul. He leads me in right paths for his name's sake.

Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff—they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord my whole life long.

Dear Members of Peace and Trinity,

As we enter into the heart of summer, I find myself, like previous years around this time, reflecting on the peacefulness that descends this time of year. God's creation is in full bloom. The heat, while at times unbearable, has become a marker of the season. At this point, I wouldn't know what to do without it! There is something beautiful about the slower pace of summer — the longer days, the time spent outdoors, and the opportunities to pause and take in the beauty of God's creation.

While many of you are gearing up for a busy harvest, it is also a time to recognize that peace and rest are not the same things, necessarily, as God's peace. To find rest and nourishment of the soul can be found in the beauty of the world, but it can also be found in the busy-ness of life, as kids are home for summer and the fields begin to turn. So, whether you are in bed taking a nap, or out on the combine in the vast expanse of a wheat field, my hope is that God's peace finds you this summer. In other words, I hope that this season is what you need it to be, and that, as in Psalm 23, it nourishes your soul.

Psalm 23 is one that transcends space and time. Every time I read it, I am grateful for the peace it proclaims. In the brokeness of the world, it proclaims a God of peace and love. It states, "The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters." God knows what we need and when we need it, whether that is a good meal after a long day, or a rest day spent inside reading. In both, and in all, God is present. God has good plans for us.

In our busy world, it's easy to forget the importance of rest, and sometimes, rest simply isn't possible. We are constantly on the move, juggling responsibilities, and pushing ourselves to do more. But Psalm 23 invites us to slow down, or at the very least to trust that God is in the mix, even as we are busy. This is not just physical rest but a deeper, spiritual rest, a rest that comes from knowing we are loved and cared for by God, who created us.

During the summer months, I encourage you to take time to rest in God's presence. Whether it's through quiet moments of prayer, reading Scripture, simply enjoying the beauty of creation, or finding five minutes on the combine to thank God for God's goodness. God's invitation to rest is not just for those who are physically tired, but for all of us who are weary in heart or spirit. Let us trust that, as our Shepherd, God is guiding us toward still waters, even in the midst of life's challenges.
