Annette started with a white board session of how the shot breaks. trigger press, breathing, follow through, focusing on even trigger pressure ( harder than it sounds). Shooting different drills on the Air Pistols took up most of the morning .with Annette and David offering suggestions. A quick tea break then some more in depth conversations about Shooting diary's and training sessions before the break for Subway lunch. After lunch we went to Range 1 and played a game called Fox and the Hunter.

The two foxes (Alison and Ben) shot first and the hunters had to catch the shooting 9s and 10s

We had a fun time then we talked about the Rapid and duelling section of Sport and Standard doing some drills that Annette gave us. There was some interesting talk on breathing and its importance during the shot process.

## SERVICE OF ALCOHOL

The club now has a liquor licence and a selection of beer and spirit mixers is available for sale and consumption on the premises

### Please note

- You can only purchase and consume alcohol once you have finished shooting for the day
- Once you have consumed any alcohol, you may not shoot or officiate in any capacity on range
- Alcohol cannot be taken on to any range (as per signage at the entrance to each range)
- Alcohol can ONLY be accessed / served by an approved RSA (no RSA on site = no alcohol available)
- Initially we are focusing on Sundays and Wednesdays with a view to extending to Tuesdays and Saturdays as RSA trained members become available.

PLEASE FOLLOW THE BELOW ADVICE AT ALL TIMES ON THE RANGE AND PACK UP IF YOU ARE THE LAST SHOOTER ON THE RANGE (FLAGS, COMPRESSOR, POWER ECT.)



## RANGE ETIQUETTE & HOUSE-KEEPING

- Please be on range at least 10 minutes prior to the scheduled match start time as a courtesy to your fellow club members who have set up and are ready to start shooting at the scheduled time
- The Range Officer has total control of the range and the match follow all Range Officer commands without exception
- On match completion, sweep up your spent brass and evaluate your used target:
  - If reusable patch it before returning it to the target storage unit for re-use
  - If shot-out dispose in one of the yellow lidded wheelie bins near the clubhouse
  - If in doubt, ask!

(The above also applies for practice sessions – please patch targets before storing for re-use)

- Assist with taking range caddies and target carriers back to the clubhouse
- Leave the range clean and tidy for the next user(s)


