TOTL RAINING ON THE LINE

Training On The Line has been, arguably, one of the most productive training courses ever offered in South Australia - and possibly Australia.

Introduced in 1981 by Alex Taransky, the course has been constructed to improve competitor's shooting techniques - whether a beginner or an accomplished competitor. The skill sets offered in TOTL are effective and fun to use - and they can be conducted "solo" or as a "team" at times that suits the individuals.

Some of the athletes that assisted Alex Taransky included Enid Newton (later Enid Boothby), Peter Schultz, Anthony Markowski and David Chapman (to mention just a few). Take this opportunity to learn techniques that have a proven track record in underpinning your existing shooting skills - regardless of your current competencies.

WHEN:

The courses will be conducted over 3 months, on FOUR weekends:

15-16 FEBRUARY, 1-2 MARCH, 29-30 MARCH and 26-27 of APRIL.

FIRST WEEKEND: Introduction, expanding on the secrets, learning to write left handed.

SECOND WEEKEND: Setting the scene for all skill levels. Activities to train for improvement.

THIRD WEEKEND: Assessment of work done. Timed fire activities for improvement.

FOURTH WEEKEND: Assessment of work done. More activities for improvement. Planning

Each day will have the same content for that weekend. It is most effective if one day each weekend is attended. We can try to make up for one day missed, two will be difficult, until the next round of weekends is decided.

VENUES: (these may change due to any weather extremes):

On each weekend, the Saturday will be at Noarlunga.

Sunday is, provisionally, at Elizebeth but with the option of Balaklava (if numbers from the north warrant it).

TIMES:

8.30am for a 9.00am start. Concludes around 4.00pm (or possibly a little later).

WHAT'S PROVIDED:

Course Notes, Diary and Exercise Sheets. Also morning and afternoon tea with snack/nibbles. (Due to the varied diets these days, it is suggested that you bring your on lunches. Fridges are available).

SERVICE OF ALCOHOL

The club now has a liquor licence and a selection of beer and spirit mixers is available for sale and consumption on the premises

Please note

- You can only purchase and consume alcohol once you have finished shooting for the day
- Once you have consumed any alcohol, you may not shoot or officiate in any capacity on range
- Alcohol cannot be taken on to any range (as per signage at the entrance to each range)
- Alcohol can ONLY be accessed / served by an approved RSA (no RSA on site = no alcohol available)
- Initially we are focusing on Sundays and Wednesdays with a view to extending to Tuesdays and Saturdays as RSA trained members become available.

PLEASE FOLLOW THE BELOW ADVICE AT ALL TIMES ON THE RANGE AND PACK UP IF YOU ARE THE LAST SHOOTER ON THE RANGE (FLAGS, COMPRESSOR, POWER ECT.)



RANGE ETIQUETTE & HOUSE-KEEPING

- Please be on range at least 10 minutes prior to the scheduled match start time as a courtesy to your fellow club members who have set up and are ready to start shooting at the scheduled time
- The Range Officer has total control of the range and the match follow all Range Officer commands without exception
- On match completion, sweep up your spent brass and evaluate your used target:
 - If reusable patch it before returning it to the target storage unit for re-use
 - If shot-out dispose in one of the yellow lidded wheelie bins near the clubhouse
 - If in doubt, ask!




- Assist with taking range caddies and target carriers back to the clubhouse
