

## **EQUINE RELEASE FORM**

Equine Body workers are NOT licensed veterinarians, therefore equine bodywork is NOT a substitute for veterinary care.

If the horse is exhibiting any signs of lameness or illness, bodywork may not take place until permission of the client's veterinarian has been granted.

- · Equine Body workers may not make and adjustments or musculoskeletal manipulations.
- Equine Body workers may not prescribe medications of any type.
- It is recommended that you consult with your veterinarian regarding complementary care for your horse.

This agreement affects your legal rights. Please read it carefully.

- I, being the authorized agent or owner of this horse, have read and understand the information on this form
- i. I understand that bodywork is not a substitute for veterinarian care, and this is it my responsibility to consult with a veterinarian regarding the complementary care for my horse.
- ii. The equine body worker does not prescribe or adminster medical treatment
- iii. I HERBY RELEASE, WAIVE and FOREVER DISCHARGE the above named Equine Body worker from all claims, debts, demands, actions, and causes of action of any kind or nature.
- iv. I waive any and all liability, claims, demands, actions and causes of action whatsoever arising out of or related to any loss, damage, or injury, including death, that may be sustained, or to any damage to property belonging to the agent or owner of the horse, whether caused by negligence of the body worker, or otherwise, from the services provided in the session noted above while on premises where the session is being performed.
