

## DSC Help is a Call Away


- Marine VHF Radio will get help up to about 20 Miles
- HF Radio May go around the world.
- HF Radio has a Ground Wave Component
  - The Signal Travels along the surface of the Earth
- HF Radio has a Sky Wave Component
  - Signal bounces between the Ionosphere and the earth
  - Can actually go all the way around the Earth

#### How to Read the Next Slides

- Following Charts show an approximate distance for a DSC Distress Call to travel.
- The Ground Wave or Direct Wave is propagating around your vessel and out to other vessels.
- The Daytime and Nighttime Sky Wave charts are only the approximate distance for the first bounce of the call. (With HF it may continue around the world)







#### If You Have DSC!

- It is important that you keep the radio on for other boaters!
- On the Icom IC M802, leaving the radio in the DSC Watch as DSC Watch is a quite mode.
  - In DSC Watch:
    - You can also Listen for Safety, Urgent, and Distress Calls.
    - You can Listen for Personal Calls from Friends.
  - ➤ Make Sure you have a DSC Antenna and your GPS are connected to the HF SSB radio!

## Other Critical Calls

- You can also use DSC for Urgent Calls.
  - The Engine will not start!
  - Some one aboard is very Sick or broke a leg!
- You can also Make and Receive Safety Calls
  - There is a log in the water at . . . . .
  - Large Wave coming . . . .
  - Rock Exposed at . . . . . .

## Calls to other Vessels

- You can Call your Friends on another boat using their MSSI number for VHF and HF with DSC.
- Make sure your MMSI is loaded in your radios.
- Put your MSSI on your Boat Card.
  - Its your phone number.
