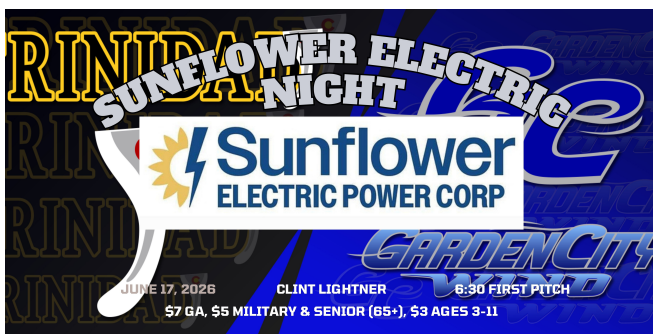
Garden City Wind vs Trinidad Triggers  
June 17 – June 20, 2026 (2 Home, 2 Road)

Garden City had a very interesting road trip that was supposed to be five games long. It all started on Friday with a wild game in Blackwell where the Flycatchers celebrated a walk off victory. Only to find out there was a scoring error, causing the league to rule the game a 20-20 tie. Then Mother Nature wiped out Saturday's game.

After a travel day on Sunday, the Wind took on the Alpine Cowboys for a double header and lost both games convincingly. They then shut out the Cowboys on Tuesday 6-0. It was the first shutout for the Wind since July 18 last year against the KC/lola Hormigas. It was the first ever shutout victory over the Cowboys, and the first shutout of the series between the two since Alpine won 3-0 on June 28, 2019.

Connor Huzicka and Trent Lowe homered in Tuesdays victory, and the Wind hope that the offense kicks it up a gear as they welcome a four game series with the Trinidad Triggers. Trinidad enters the series at 11-3 and Garden City is 11-3-1. The two teams are at the top of both the Mountain North, and the Pecos League standings.

Wednesday is Sunflower Electric Night at Clint Lightner. Thursday is \$1 Beer Night Thirsty Thursday presented by Lewis Automotive Group. Friday and Saturday are on the road in Trinidad. Garden City will welcome Alpine to town on Sunday which is also Fathers Day and El Zarape Day at the ballpark.

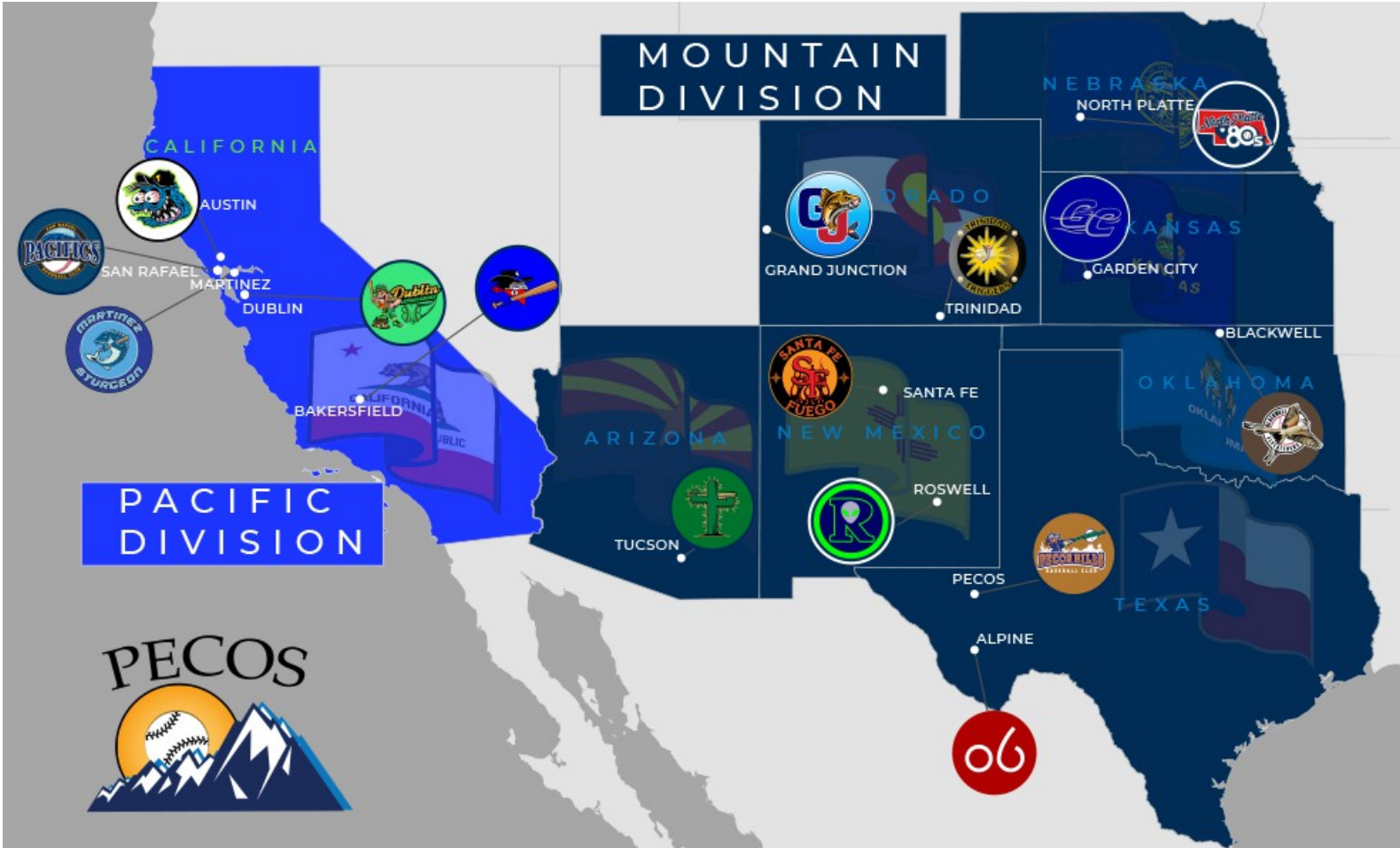

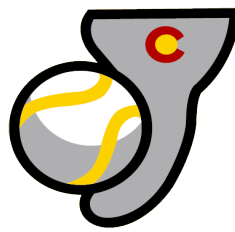

## 2015 Season

The Garden City Wind played their inaugural season against Trinidad, Alpine, Santa Fe, Roswell, White Sands, and Las Vegas (NM). They began the season with two exhibition spring training games, losing to both the Wichita Wingnuts and the Amarillo Thunderheads.

The Wind would go 21-43 in it's first season, finishing in last place in the Northern Division under manager Mike Reeves.

## **2017 Season**

The 2017 season was a rough one for the Garden City Wind under manager David Peterson. The team faced Trinidad, Alpine, Santa Fe, Roswell and White Sands, posting a winning record over only the Pupfish. This season marked the first year the Pecos League split into the Mountain and Pacific Divisions. Garden City would finish fifth in the Mountain Division, 7 games ahead of last place White Sands at 19-43. A bright spot in the season was Garden City hosting the Mountain Division All Star Game for the first time on July 11, 2017.

## **2018 Season**

2018 was the worst season in franchise history for the Garden City Wind. They began the year with player/manager Ian Horne, but after his callup to the Can-Am League, were led by Nolan Cherniwchan. The Wind failed to tally a winning record against any opponent for the first time ever. They would play Trinidad, Alpine, Santa Fe, and Roswell. Garden City faced Trinidad 26 times losing 23 to their rivals. The Pecos League was split into the Southern, Mountain and Pacific Divisions, with The Wind finishing last in the Mountain at 11-51.

The 11 wins are the lowest in franchise history all time. The 51 losses are the most. Only White Sands at 7-51 had a worse record in the league.

### **2019 Season**

Garden City bounced back in 2019 and earned their second playoff berth in franchise history. David Peterson returned as manager and the team set a record for wins going 42-20 and earning a Wild Card. They played against Trinidad, Alpine, Roswell, Santa Fe and White Sands. Garden City hosted a wild card playoff series against Roswell, getting swept by the Invaders. The team set multiple franchise records to that point including wins (42), win streak (6), runs scored in a game (26) and fewest losses (20) among others. They finished second in the six team Mountain Division, three games back of Alpine. They also posted their first winning records over Santa Fe and rival Trinidad.

### **2020 Season**

Garden City did not participate in the 2020 Pecos League bubble season in Houston. Though manager David Peterson led the Salina Stockade who played for the Pecos League Championship, getting swept by Tucson.





## 2021 Season

The Wind returned to the diamond in 2021 with a new manager in Garrett Totty. They would go on to having another record breaking year and once again found themselves in the postseason as a Wild Card team. Garden City spent most of the year chasing the Colorado Springs Snow Sox and would finish 33-22. Colorado Springs won the Mountain North Division in the regular season with Garden City taking second. However, due to stadium and scheduling issues in Colorado Springs the first round of the playoffs would be played between the two in Garden City.

The Wind would go on to win their first playoff series in franchise history taking two of three from the Snow Sox. They then hosted the Roswell Invaders for the Mountain Division Championship, falling short two games to one.

The Garden City Wind set a new franchise record for runs scored in a game (27), and tied the longest win streak in franchise history at 6.

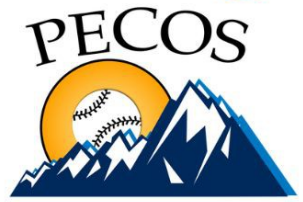

## **2022 Season**

The Garden City Wind entered the 2022 season with high expectations. This was shown by the attendance record at Clint Lightner Ballpark being broken a number of times. Under returning manager Garrett Totty, they would have their hottest start in franchise history winning their first 8 games and 17 of their first 20. Garden City faced Trinidad, Alpine, Roswell, Santa Fe, Colorado Springs, Weimar and Austin. The Wind had a winning record against all but Roswell in the regular season.

Garden City would go on to win their second division title in franchise history with a record of 36-10 holding off Alpine by 5.5 games in the Mountain Division.

However, The Wind would find a familiar foe in the postseason, hosting the Roswell Invaders for the third postseason in a row. Roswell would once again win two of three and move on to the next round. Eventually winning the Pecos League Championship.

## 2024 Season

Easton Barnes was the skipper for the Wind in 2024 and led the team to one of the best seasons in franchise history.

Multiple records fell in 2024 as the team got out to an 8-0 start and added a 12 game win streak in July.

Jordan Williams set the team record with 38 steals and Brendan Beard set the single game strikeout record with 15.

The team went 42-9 securing the Mountain North for the third time in franchise history.

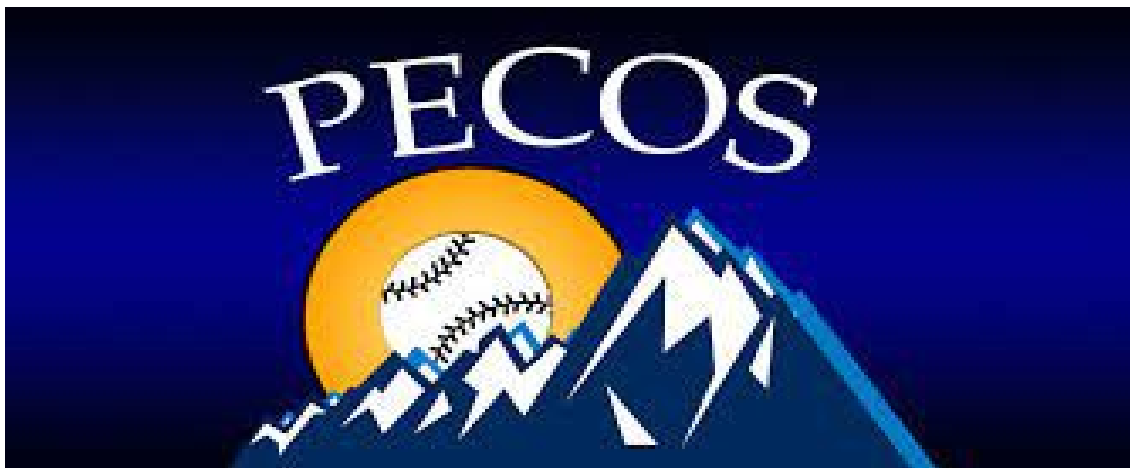
