

**ALL SAINTS' MEMORIAL CHURCH
CEMETERY AND MEMORIAL GARDEN
GUIDELINES**

Visitation

The All Saints' Cemetery is open for visitation seven days a week, all year around, from sunup to sundown. However, there are times when a Parish Event or Sunday services may impede access to the cemetery. Please check the church website and calendar, or contact the Office in advance, if are concerned about access.

The Church retains a landscaper to regularly mow the cemetery and grounds, and to remove leaves in the fall. All other work is done by volunteers, as they able, or is the responsibility of the plot owner.

In case of snowfall: the cemetery is not plowed, and access will be limited to foot traffic. In case of deep snow or frozen ground, burials may have to be delayed until the ground become accessible.

Cemetery Plots

Our cemetery plots are deeded to the owner, and we request that any deed transfers or sales be reported to the Office so appropriate records can be kept.

Plot owners are responsible for the maintenance of their own plot including maintenance of any bushes or trees planted. Please do not plant any trees or larger plants that may encroach on another nearby plot. If a tree or plant naturally starts growing on your plot, and needs to be removed, please contact the Office.

Any and all markers, candles, memorial objects, etc. must be kept within the confines of the boundaries of your plot.

Please be respectful of the grounds when visiting, and do not leave behind any trash or lightweight items that may be blown over or become a projectile in a storm. Pets are more than welcome; please clean up after your pet.

Even though plot owners own their own plots, please do not bury any human or pet cremains without contacting the Office and notifying the Clergy.

Memorial Garden

That All Saints' Memorial Garden, located on the upper tier of the cemetery, is a place where cremains are interred directly into the earth. Names can engraved on the communal headstone provided (this is at the family's cost, arranged with Uras Monuments in Middletown, NJ).

Please make all arrangements for Memorial Garden burial with the Office and Clergy. There is a small fee for grave openings.

Visitors may leave cut flowers near the headstones. Please do not plant any flowers or plants in the plot area, which runs from the headstones to the bench, and out to the bushes lining either side. Please do not add statues, marker stones, or other items. This is a communal plot for all interred there, and we need to be mindful of shared space.

Available Plots

Many of the plots in the cemetery have already been deeded/sold, and are currently restricted to parishioners and related community members. There is availability in the Memorial Garden.
