SHAWANGUNK NATURE PRESERVE

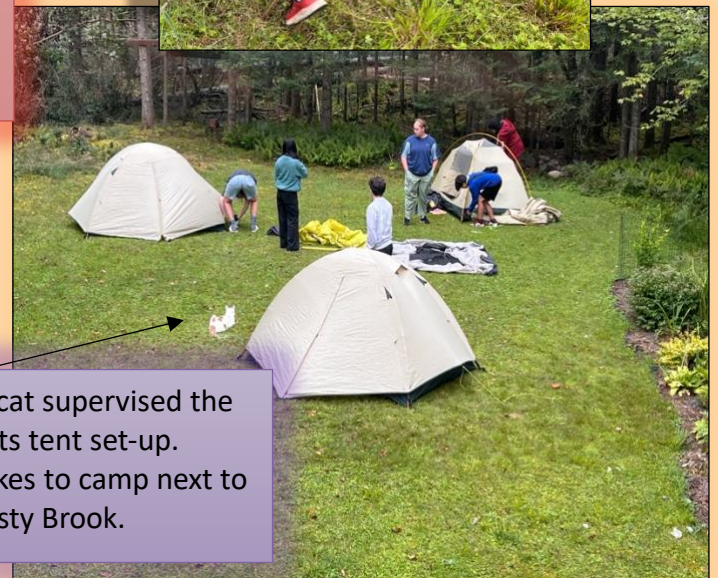

May we be wise and avoid the dangers that it poses. May we be forgiving to sidestep the hurts and grudges it could bring.

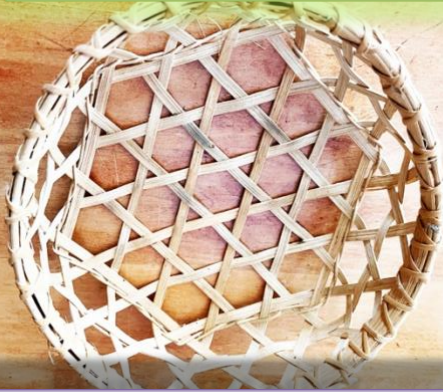
May we be loving enough to transcend the ill will and rejection that it may harbor. May we be understanding to extract from it the peace that invests it.
