


Upcoming Workshop: NEEDLE FELTED BUNNY or CHICK


Saturday, March 23, 2024.


10 am - 1 pm

In the spring of 2023,
GreenUtica planted 12 trees in the
Sullivan Memorial Grove in Proctor
Park and 52 trees on the Memorial
Parkway. This 21-year-old community
based non-profit organization has
invested over one million dollars in
Utica's nearly 600 acres of parks,
planting trees & flowers making clean
& green spaces readily accessible.

Besides the lovely trails at Shawangunk, here is another nearby trail to explore.

ON EGYPT RD. in Boonville you will find a beautiful trail, open year around which is 14.4 miles out and back. Pictured here is a comfortable warming hut offered there and young Sylvia Behrendt taking a rest on the trail after walking it with her Home School group. The Black River Environmental Improvement Association [BREIA] is a nonprofit funded by Butler Conservation.

BREIA now offers more than 50 kilometers of trails, making it one of the largest classic ski, snowshoe, and mountain biking trail systems in the East. There are four more public locations besides the one in Boonville each offering a distinctive experience for walking, hiking, mountain biking, cross-country skiing and snowshoeing.

Access to the trails and facilities is free, and donations are not accepted. The trails remain open throughout the year and offer hiking / biking opportunities during the warm seasons, and snowshoeing / cross-country skiing in the winter months.

It's recommended to check trail conditions before visiting.
