Member Spotlight!

Marsha Greenstreet

Marsha Greenstreet is a charter member of the Twin City Area Optimist club and the club's first president. In 1987, she was working at Commerce Bank, acting as a bank representative to local service organizations, when three gentlemen from Cape Girardeau met with state Senator Jack Gannon to propose a new Optimist International club in Festus/Crystal City. The Senator declined the proposal saying there were enough service organizations in the area. Delegates at the Optimist



International Convention had revised the organization's constitution to admit women members. The gentlemen approached Ruth Tucker at the Chamber of Commerce for help. Ruth provided three women's names including Senator Gannon's own daughter and Rosetta Hagan, a local businesswoman. Marsha was approached by Rosetta to see if she would be interested in helping form an Optimist club in the area.

At the time, many service organizations were men only with women involved in auxiliary clubs. But businesswomen and women in general wanted more than an auxiliary role. Word spread and when the club was chartered in May 1988, there were 63 members! Shirley Overberg was first approached to be president and she declined due to work responsibilities but suggested Marsha, who was then voted in as the first club president. Marsha served in that capacity for one and one-half years. She says the role changed her life, forcing her to speak in front of the entire club when she previously had no public speaking experience.

One Optimist project Marsha is especially proud of is the Head Start holiday parties. These were started the first year the club was chartered. One member, Mavis Witte, who accompanied her photographer husband to the public schools, noticed that some of the children lacked basic items. Mavis and Irma Graham came up with the party idea and held the first one in December 1988. This also led to the Coats for Kids project in later years when a member at one of the Head Start parties noticed a child who needed a coat.

Marsha has been an insurance agent for 36 years, leaving the bank when she was approached about taking over a small Farmers Insurance agency in Hillsboro in 1989. She stayed with Farmers for 15 years before becoming an independent agent. She and her husband Jerry, Director of Building and Grounds at Jefferson College before retiring, have two children. Son Jeff lives with his family in South Carolina and daughter Dana lives with her family in Dittmer, Missouri. Between

them, Marsha has five grandchildren and two great-grandchildren that she's very proud of.

Cooking has always been a favorite pastime of Marsha's. She ran community dinners at her church for 15 years, regularly serving ~100 people. She reads cookbooks for fun and at one time she had over 350 cookbooks of her own!

When asked about her favorite line in the Optimist Creed, Marsha had a hard time identifying just one. She believes that a person who lives by the creed or tries to live by it is exceptional. After she quoted "To be too large for worry, too noble for anger, too strong for fear, and too happy to permit the presence of trouble", she said there's just so much meaning in that last line.

Marsha was very involved with Optimists for many years before having to step back for work. She has always viewed the Twin City Area Optimist Club as the best service club in Jefferson County. She is member #1 and proud to have had a part in starting the club. She and the other charter members set a course for the club that we are still following today.

Missouri Kids Unplugged

Rodney Bickel returned to talk about Missouri Kids Unplugged, an organization based in Dittmer, Missouri that provides for children to participate in device and screen-free activities. The season for Missouri Kids Unplugged is usually April – October and they are now closed for the year. The winter months are spent preparing for the next season!

The land used for Missouri Kids Unplugged events is private property and is only accessible on event days. The activities offered include fishing, hiking, and biking. They also speak in schools and at community events. Notices are posted on social media and in The Leader, and do require RSVPs so they can gauge the volunteer and supply requirements for each event. The property is handicap accessible.

Many of the Missouri Kids Unplugged education events focus on responsible recycling, which provides jobs and protects the environment. Rodney displayed some of the “old” technology that younger people may not be able to identify, but many of our members easily recognized such as a rotary phone, a CD player, and a VCR camera. Most electronics are recyclable, but getting them to a responsible recycling company is important. Rodney mentioned events where they have provided old Chromebooks and let kids tear into them to show that they’re 100% recyclable!
