All for Family

The speakers from All for Family were Optimist Amy Baum, President of the Board of Directors for All for Family, and Heather Frazier, the new Program Director.

All for Family (AFF) was started in 2018 by Angel Williams, who through being both a foster child and a foster parent, identified a need. Bio parents who are approved for supervised visits with their children in foster care must often

provide their own supervisor, but may lack the resources to do so. All for Family provides free or low-cost options by using qualified volunteers and safe meeting facilities to help families stay connected. Visits are for parents as well as siblings who may not be in the same home.

AFF also offers therapeutic visitation for families who need additional support. This is a no or low-cost option for families compared to the usual costs for professional services.

AFF volunteers have to be approved by the Missouri Department of Social Services-Children's Division, pass a background check and undergo training. While generally being observers during a visit, they may, if prompted, offer guidance or suggestions for future visits. Some volunteers "adopt" a family and supervise all the visits with that family. For each visit, volunteers complete a report which is sent to the family case manager after the visit.

Currently, AFF has locations in Hillsboro and Arnold, both with indoor and outdoor facilities equipped to support visits.

Funding is provided by donations, fundraisers, and grants. The primary grant is through the Jefferson Foundation. Crafting fundraisers are held multiple times a year with the next one scheduled for August 1-2, 2025.


CLUB FUNDRAISERS
