## In Memoriam Marsha Greenstreet



Marsha Greenstreet, one of The Twin City Area Optimist Club's charter members, passed peacefully on November 18, 2025. Marsha was not only a charter member, but the first president of our club. She was club member #1 and very proud of that fact. She viewed the Twin City Area Optimist Club as the best service club in Jefferson County and repeatedly said that this was the best group of women to work with ever.

Becoming a member of the Optimists changed Marsha's life. It taught her how to get up and speak in front of people. It helped her to build confidence in herself to the extent that she started her own business. While membership and leadership positively affected Marsha, she used these attributes to define what this club would become and how it would serve the community she loved.

The Head Start Holiday parties, a special project in her heart, were started the first year of the club while Marsha was president and continue to this day. She believed that every child deserves joy, hope, and a positive vision for the future. She made sure our club lived that belief out loud.

Marsha was an active participant in the club as time permitted. She never shied away from any project and easily recruited others to help. She helped match new members with mentors and took on the mentor role herself for some members. She

hosted the September board meeting that both the outgoing and incoming boards attend every year until this year.

One of the greatest gifts Marsha gave to the club was her friendship, which was so important to so many people. She believed in helping others and fully supported anyone who was working to do the same. She encouraged the people in her life to take care of themselves through healthy living, by saying 'no' when needed, and by facing life with a positive attitude.

Marsha faced life with optimism that wasn't naïve, but brave. She served her community with an open heart, with strength, compassion, and with tireless energy. Marsha lived the Optimist creed in which she believed so strongly, especially the last line "To be too large for worry, too noble for anger, too strong for fear, and too happy to permit the presence of trouble. " She will be dearly missed by all.

## **December 4, 2025 Board Updates**

Winterfest: Our club decided not to participate in Winterfest this year due to the prediction of cold weather.



#### **ORATORICAL CONTEST**

Beginning in 1928, the Oratorical Contest has become the longest-running program of Optimist International. The contest is designed for young people to gain experience in public speaking and provide them with an opportunity to compete for multiple college scholarships with a pre-assigned topic.

#### **ESSAY CONTEST**

The Essay Contest is sponsored by Optimist International to give young people the opportunity to write about their own opinions regarding the world in which they live. The approach can encompass a young person's personal experience, the experience of their country or a more historical perspective. In addition to developing skills for written expression, participants also have the opportunity to win a college scholarship!

#### COMMUNICATION CONTEST FOR THE DEAF & HARD OF HEARING

This contest offers an opportunity for students who are Deaf or Hard-of-Hearing to present their thoughts in the community, gaining skills, which can only come from signing or speaking to a large audience. Patterned after the Optimist Oratorical Contest, the contest offers youth the chance to compete in speech or sign language with the chance to win a college scholarship.

#### KIDS SPEAK OUT! SPEECH CONTEST

All young people can compete in the Optimist Oratorical Contest. The "Kids Speak Out" contest is a "pre-Oratorical" program that provides a more equitable competition for younger speakers.

The **Optimist International Essay and Oratorical Contests** are annual scholarship competitions sponsored by Optimist International to provide young people with the opportunity to express their views and win college scholarships.

The Essay Contest gives students a chance to write about their opinions on a preassigned topic related to the world they live in. **Prizes:** Winners at the club level advance to the District contest to compete for a scholarship, typically **\$2,500** at the District level, funded by the Optimist International Foundation.

The Oratorical Contest is a public speaking competition where youngsters prepare and deliver a speech on a pre-assigned topic. It's one of the longest-running programs of Optimist International. **Prizes:** More than **\$150,000** in college


scholarships is awarded annually. District winners can receive **\$2,500** for first place, with a chance to win up to **\$22,500** at the World Championships level.
