Member Spotlight Debbie Floyd



A member of the Twin City Area Optimist Club since September, 2022, Debbie Floyd worked as a Regulatory Specialist for 40 years, the last 10 years as a consultant working from home. A breast cancer diagnosis led her and her husband Mike to relocate from Terre Haute, Indiana to the Festus area for accessibility to better medical options and to be closer to one of their sons. Having little support in the St. Louis area and wanting to give back to the community, Debbie's realtor suggested she join the Optimist club. Debbie contacted Jean Naeger who sponsored her membership.



While Debbie still receives treatment and is closely monitored, her health is steadily improving. She most recently was diagnosed with cancer of the digestive system followed by surgeries and treatments. She was private about her condition until the doctors made a diagnosis. Along with the medical care she found in the St. Louis area, she credits the power of prayer and is thankful for all the positive thoughts and support she has received from the Twin City Area Optimist Club.

Debbie and Mike have been married for 38 years and have two sons. Joel lives in Herculaneum with his family including grandchildren Chloe, 14, and Rhys, 10. Their other son, Tyler, settled in Colorado, with grandchildren Lily, 19, and Dylan, 16. While distance makes visits difficult, the entire immediate family traveled to Colorado this past December to spend the holidays together after Tyler was unable to get time away from his job.

Since retiring from her job last year, Debbie and Mike have plans to travel. They invested in a motor home and have a travel priority list that includes visits to family and friends as well as new adventures around the country.



Debbie is a true animal lover. She's one of those rare people that animals seem to innately trust. More than once, owners have been astonished by their pet's immediate ease with her, especially when those same animals are hesitant with nearly everyone else. While still in Terre Haute, Debbie was President of the Humane Society and fostered many dogs. She regularly picked the dogs that other people were more likely to pass by - pregnant dogs. She fostered the mothers through the

birth until all of the puppies were old enough to be adopted. She estimates that she's fostered close to 100 puppies over time. The story of JoJo, the lipless pittie, is the story she is most proud of. Debbie arranged for the placement (in another town) of a

pitbull that had been used for dog fighting. Her story went viral and she made national news. The person who adopted JoJo trained her to be a support dog. We all love happy endings!

Two of the lines of the Optimist creed stand out to Debbie, “To give so much time to the improvement of yourself, that you have no time to criticize others” and “To be too large for worry, too noble for anger, too strong for fear, and too happy to permit the presence of trouble”. She sees these as goals that can help ease the heavy worry so many people carry.

As a member of the TCA Optimists, Debbie jumps in wherever she’s needed— planning parties, supporting food drives, joining shopping trips, and engaging fully in club meetings. Her participation always comes with a warm, generous spirit and a joyful willingness to help. Debbie’s steady presence and wholehearted involvement capture the heart of our Optimist spirit.

April 23, 2026 True North Music

Anne Gegg from True North Music was the guest speaker at the April 23 meeting. Among other services, True North Music provides Music Therapy for individuals or groups. Anne has worked as a Music Therapist for more than 15 years and specializes in working with individuals with mental health problems and in memory care for Alzheimer's and dementia patients.

During her presentation, Anne described how Music Therapy affects the brain and other bodily structures. Music is the only sensory experience that can activate all areas of the brain simultaneously. Research has shown that participating in music activity increases the levels of dopamine, which is necessary for learning, as well as endorphins, which are natural pain relievers, and serotonin, a mood-stabilizer. In addition to the increase in “feel-good” chemicals, research has noted decreased cortisol production, the stress hormone.



Anne noted that Music Therapy is used to treat people from neo-natal age through the elderly. She reminded us that we are musical beings, with exposure to music starting in the womb with the heartbeat of the mother.

Other uses of Music Therapy:

- Mental Health experts use music to give feelings a voice.
- There are studies in the use of Music Therapy to help individuals with dyslexia, learning disorders, and speech issues such as stuttering.
- For individuals with memory issues, exposure to music from their youth or significant life events can trigger a positive reaction.

In addition to music therapy, True North Music offers music lessons, music for events, and even provides singing telegrams in Jefferson County!

James II Project - Making a Difference in Our Community

At our April 30 evening meeting, we welcomed Karin Kostich, founder of the James II Project. Karin shared the inspiring story behind her mission to serve the unhoused and underprivileged by meeting people where they are—offering not only a warm meal, but also dignity, compassion, and most importantly, connection.



What began in June 2023 as a single meal service at the Salvation Army in Arnold, Missouri, has grown into a thriving outreach. Today, the James II Project serves two meals each week in Arnold and an additional meal at First United Methodist Church in Festus, reaching an average of 40–60 individuals at each gathering.

These meals are about more than food. Each event brings together dedicated teams from organizations like Compass Health, Chestnut Health, St. Vincent de Paul, the VA, and the Salvation Army, all working together to connect individuals with vital services and support.

We also heard from our own Florence Borman, who recognized an opportunity to expand the impact of the Festus meals. She established a missions closet at First United Methodist Church, collecting essential items such as shoes, socks, and winter clothing. Through grant funding, she has even helped provide tents and sleeping bags. Florence's ongoing involvement ensures that those attending the meals receive both practical assistance and heartfelt care.

Karin concluded with several powerful success stories—individuals who, through the support of the James II Project, have found housing, employment, and renewed hope.

Karin and Florence expressed that the people attending have become like family and how invested they both are in finding ways to help all of them.

The mission of the James II Project—beautifully reflects the Optimist Creed's call "to be just as enthusiastic about the success of others as you are about your own." This was wonderful example of how compassion, collaboration, and community can create meaningful change.

All young people can compete in the Optimist Oratorical Contest. The "Kids Speak Out" contest is a "pre-Oratorical" program that provides a more equitable competition for younger speakers.

The **Optimist International Essay and Oratorical Contests** are annual scholarship competitions sponsored by Optimist International to provide young people with the opportunity to express their views and win college scholarships.

The Essay Contest gives students a chance to write about their opinions on a pre-assigned topic related to the world they live in. **Prizes:** Winners at the club level advance to the District contest to compete for a scholarship, typically **\$2,500** at the District level, funded by the Optimist International Foundation.

The Oratorical Contest is a public speaking competition where youngsters prepare and deliver a speech on a pre-assigned topic. It's one of the longest-running programs of Optimist International. **Prizes:** More than **\$150,000** in college

scholarships is awarded annually. District winners can receive **\$2,500** for first place, with a chance to win up to **\$22,500** at the World Championships level.
