Special thanks to project chair Pam Cernik for completing her first Head Start Food Basket Project. The rain could not stop our mighty volunteers from completing their tasks.





The can will already be bent, and holes drilled for hanger. You can choose from the two patriotic themed bucket patterns shown below. **NOTE:** Florals are for display purposes only.

We will provide all the materials needed to complete project (there may be a small fee to cover supply costs). You will base coat the bucket with paint, add a layer of Mod Podge, and decoupage a napkin onto the bucket. If you prefer a different pattern, feel free to bring a napkin or tissue paper of your choice. It would be helpful to bring paint brushes (2-inch paint brushes work best.)
