





the services this organization
provides.



Head Start (HS) and Early Head Start (EHS) is funded to serve pregnant mothers, infants, and toddlers in its EHS program. Children three to five are served through HS. Programs provide prenatal care, family enrichment, health and wellness, and educational instruction.

JFCAC can also direct parents to other services within its organization such as housing, behavioral health services, energy assistance, WIC, etc.

Currently JFCAC serves 478 children, approximately 140 of those children are served by the Hematite and DeSoto HS centers in southern Jefferson County.
