Community of Hope - Haiti Club ZOOM Meeting April 15, 2021 Speaker Heather Tucker



Heather and Brian Tucker, Co-Founders/Executive Directors, Community of Hope Haiti, Inc. and their children set out on a mission. They wanted to invest in the next generation.

Their mission began in 2014 on Grand Vide, Haiti on the island of LaGonave, 31 miles from mainland Haiti. Traveling to this area was dangerous, with a five hour boat ride to send an email buy eggs, etc. Supplies, logistics, and economic growth was stunted.

They prayed for a boat to make travel safer and after three years their prayers were answered. The villagers built a pier which provided jobs, hope, and the door for commerce. A boat lift was installed to protect boats and provide safe transport. Deliveries came for the first time.

A depot for fish processing, ice, and fuel was built. By partnering with local fishermen and practicing sustainable fishing they were able to produce food and jobs, while restoring depleted fisheries. Fisherman were able to sell their fish in the market. A community center was built and more grades were added to the local school.

The Tuckers did not go to Haiti to give a man a fish to eat for a day but provided the resources to teach a man to fish so he will eat for a lifetime.

In February 2020, For His Families, Inc. opened the doors of its new program called THE PROJECT to connect with parents, children and families and grow our community through group activities, family events, and community service projects.

Our volunteers are everyday people doing everyday things to make everlasting impacts in everyday lives.

Through this first year of operation, most of our volunteers have been students from Crystal City Elementary School since we happen to be located right next door. Despite COVID-19 shutdowns, The Project survived its first year. Approximately 15 to 18 volunteers participate in the program daily and earn service hours. Since the program began, volunteers of The Project have given 2609.5 hours of their time toward activities and services to make our world better and brighter.

Each month the volunteers participate in various contests. They compete against one another to earn the most service hours and win gift cards. They also work cooperatively to reach group service hour goals. If all of their combined service hours reach or surpass the goal, then the volunteers are awarded a celebration (e.g., a BBQ and fun day at the park, pizza party and cosmic bowl, group night at the movies, etc.). Additionally, volunteers earn tickets based upon

their service hours and by completing tasks on Community Service Bingo cards, which are then entered into monthly drawings.

The volunteers seem to truly enjoy the activities and services they provide. These are just some of the differences and joys they have made in our community: Artwork hung in the Main Street windows for "Shine Bright Main Street", Giant Jenga sets for Sunnyhill and My Place, Valentines for nursing centers, Built their own bike rack, Built and currently maintaining their own garden, Re-Painting Fire Hydrants throughout Crystal City, Helped unload the U-Haul for a new family in town, Helped a neighbor rehab a retaining wall, Assisting with prep work for the Friday night homeless ministry, and opening soon ... Free Community Puzzle Library.


Congratulations to our Oratorical Contest Winner
