Veteran Morgage Advisor



Mary Catherine Baragary has been a mortgage loan officer with Hancock Mortgage for 15 years and opened an office in Festus 4 years ago. She has also been certified as a Veteran Mortgage Advisor. To receive this certification she had to complete >50 courses and multiple tests. She now teaches primarily real estate agents about VA Loans. There is a stigma that VA loans are not as good as other types of loans so Mary Catherine is trying to change the misconceptions and promote VA home ownership. VA loans can be used for 100% financing with no money down which causes some sellers and agents to doubt the VA loans.

Statistics show that twenty-two veterans lose their life to suicide each day. This is 4 times more than combat deaths. Home ownership provides stability for the family and can help combat this.

Some of the myths that Mary Catherine is trying to debunk are:

- No money down makes for a weaker borrower. Veterans do have to meet requirements to get a VA loan. Lenders still look at credit scores, assets, etc.
- VA loans are harder to get through underwriting. The VA guarantees the loans meaning the lenders actually have more assurance of repayment.
- VA loans take longer to close. The truth is that VA loans on average close within 5 days of a conventional loan but can close much faster.
- You can only have one VA loan at a time. Loans are based on eligibility, entitlements, and qualifications so it is possible to have multiple loans at any given time.

Some other positives to VA loans are that

- Veterans can use their benefits over and over again.
- The waiting period for a VA loan after a foreclosure is 2 years while other loans may require a much longer waiting period.
- There is no maximum loan amount.
- VA appraisers are not more rigid or tough than other appraisers. Regardless of the type of loan, the house must meet safety requirements.
- Surviving spouses may be entitled to use VA benefits

Mary Catherine had 3 primary takeaways for us:

- If/when you are selling your home, don't dismiss a Veteran's offer.
- If you hear a veteran is looking to buy, make sure they are using a VMA loan officer.
- THANK A VETERAN.

Mary Catherine also told us about R.E.D which stands for "Remember Everyone Deployed". This is a national campaign to show support for the US Military who are deployed



overseas, anyone thinking about enlisting, and to honor veterans. To participate and thank active military personnel as well as veterans, wear red on Fridays!

Mary Catherine sells red t-shires that she helped design for \$22 which goes to USA Cares. USA Cares is a non-profit organization that provides post-9/11 Veteran and Military families support.




