August 14, 2025 Back to Play



Nicole Alleman, Back to Play

Nicole Alleman from Back to Play was the speaker at the August 14, 2025 meeting. Back to Play is a nonprofit, indoor playroom and family support center located on Main Street in De Soto, Missouri. The center's mission is "to help children thrive through their natural desire to play, while providing a community space for caregivers to connect and feel supported."

The physical facility includes play areas for physical and creative activities, sensory activities and a calming room. Seating areas for parents and guardians allow supervision, relaxation and networking with other adults. A private office space is available for rental by therapists, case managers and youth clinicians. Private playroom options are available for occupational therapists, speech therapists etc. A therapy dog soon will be volunteering for supervised visits, private therapy sessions and therapeutic events.

In addition to the daily play options, Back to Play hosts caregiver workshops and collaborates with other agencies to provide even more resources. They have giveaways throughout the year such as Halloween Costume help, Easter baskets and birthday parties. At Christmas they partner with organizations to provide Christmas presents for families in the community. They also sponsor local teens at Christmas as some holiday drives only provide gifts for children up to age 12.

Additional resources are offered to provide postpartum support in the form of connections and resources for parents. The facility helps caregivers by providing much-needed items such as diapers and wipes, an infant scale and a measuring mat.

As a non-profit, Back to Play relies on volunteers. An area specifically requested was for home school workshops. If anyone has a skill or hobby they would be interested in teaching, please reach out to Back to Play. A recent request received is for crochet lessons!

Celebrate + Address+ Recognize= Excel

The C.A.R.E. Program is an Optimist International structured plan for clubs to celebrate their accomplishments while resolving issues and strengthening membership. The annual program is designed to help keep Optimist club membership healthy, strong, and engaged while allowing everyone to feel they have a voice and an influence in the club's direction. The C.A.R.E. acronym stands for **C**elebrate + **A**ddress+ **R**ecognize= **E**xcel.

The program was preceded with an anonymous survey sent to membership by Liz Christman, our facilitator for the "address" portion of the program. More than double the number of recipients responded to the survey this year from last year. Before diving into the survey results, Liz reviewed the concept of the "word cloud" which is a method for evaluating the results of the surveys by selecting reoccurring words; the more often they are found, the larger they become on the

results. These words reflect the members' feelings about the questions being asked.

Membership was heavily discussed as a result to multiple survey questions. While membership has grown in the past year, our members recognize the need to engage with new members. The new member orientations implemented in the past year have made a positive impact, but it takes time to get to know people, especially in a club of our size.

The question of membership also led to the topic of communication which our club generally does via email and

Facebook. Liz pointed out that younger members tend to prioritize other communication methods such as Instagram and text messaging.

Overall, feedback was positive about the Twin City Area Optimist Club with Liz noting that one of the "issues" identified was that our members want to be friends with all the other members!

The final survey question asked for ideas for new projects, activities or fundraisers for our club. Suggestions ranged from getting involved with other community service clubs in the area to adding new programs to expand our support for children.


