

- Ordinance No 3 -

Prohibiting the riding or driving of horses on the pavements or sidewalks of the Borough.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Patterson Heights and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same: That from and after the 1st day of December, A.D. 1899, it shall be unlawful for any person to ride or drive any horse, mule or any other animal, with or without a vehicle, upon the pavements, sidewalks or sidepaths of the said borough.

Any person or persons violating the provisions of the foregoing ordinance shall upon conviction thereof before the burgess or any Justice of the Peace of said borough, forfeit and pay to said Burgess or Justice of the Peace for the use of the borough a fine of not less than one nor more than five dollars for each and every offense, together with all costs, to be collected in like manner as other fines and penalties are now collected, and in default of such payment upon conviction, such person or persons so convicted shall be sentenced to the County Jail by the said Burgess or Justice of the Peace for a period not to exceed five days.
