

## Ordinance No. 5.

Prohibiting horses, cattle, sheep, swine, geese, and other animals running at large, or being tethered upon the streets, avenues, lanes, alleys and highways within the limits of the Borough of Patterson Heights.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Town Council of the Borough of Patterson Heights; and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 1. That from and after September 1, 1901, it shall be unlawful for the owner or owners of any horse, cattle, sheep, swine, geese or other animals to allow the same to run at large, or to tie, tether, or herd the same, or permit the same to be done, on any of the streets, avenues, lanes, alleys, and highways, within the limits of the Borough of Patterson Heights.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the high constable, police man, street commissioner or other person or persons that the Town Council may appoint for that purpose, to seize and take any such horses, cattle, sheep, swine, geese, or other animal that may be found running at large or that may be tied, tethered or herded on any of the streets, avenues, lanes, alleys and high ways, within the limits of said borough, and the sum of seventy-five cents shall be allowed such officer or other person, for any seizure so made, to be paid by the owner, or owners thereof, in addition to the fine and costs herein imposed.

Section 3. That all horses, cattle, sheep, swine, geese, or other animals so taken, shall be placed in pound or other place provided for their detention, and there kept for forty-eight hours, and upon the failing of the owner or owners thereof to reclaim the same within that time, and pay the fine

therein mentioned, with all costs, the impounding officer shall sell the same at public outcry, -after having given three days public notice of the time and place of such sale by not less than ten advertisements put up in the most public places in said borough; the proceeds of said sale after payment of costs to be paid to the borough treasurer for the use of the borough.

Section 4. Any person violating Section 1 of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction before the burgess of said borough, or any justice of the peace forfeit and pay for the use of said borough, a fine of not less than one, nor more than five dollars, together with costs, and in default thereof shall be sentenced to the county jail for a period not exceeding ten days.

Section 5. All ordinances, -or parts of ordinances, inconsistent herewith, be, -and the same are, hereby repealed.
