

Ordinance # 214.

An ordinance establishing the grade of the North Curb of Third Avenue, from Darlington Avenue to Fern Avenue in the Borough of Patterson Heights, Penna.

Be it enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Patterson Heights, Penna. and it is hereby ordained by authority of the same that the grade of the North curb of Third Avenue from the east curb of Darlington Avenue to the west curb of Fern Avenue, be, and the same is hereby established as follows, to-wit:-

Beginning at the east curb of Darlington Avenue at an elevation of one thousand and sixty six (1066.0) feet; thence descending for a distance of two hundred and eighty nine and five tenths (289.5) feet, to the west curb of Barker Avenue at an elevation of one thousand and sixty four and five tenths (1064.5) feet; thence descending for a distance of twenty four (24.0) feet to the east curb of said Barker Avenue at an elevation of one thousand and sixty three and two tenths (1063.2) feet; thence descending for a distance of three hundred and twenty six (326.0) feet to the west curb

of Harrah Avenue, at an elevation of one thousand and forty three and six tenths (1043.⁶) feet; thence descending for a distance of Twenty four (24.0) feet to the east curb of said Harrah Avenue at an elevation of one thousand and forty three (1043.0) feet; thence descending for a distance of Three hundred and twenty six (326.0) feet to the west curb of Fern Avenue at an elevation of one thousand and thirty seven and five tenths feet (1037.⁵) feet.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with the provisions of this enactment, be and the same are hereby repealed.

And the Borough Engineer is hereby authorized to draft grade as herein established in the book known as the Boro Grade Book
