

Ordinance #30

An ordinance establishing the grade of Myrtle Avenue from Central Avenue to First Avenue, in the Borough of Patterson Heights, Penna.

Be it enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Patterson Heights Penna., and it is hereby ordained by authority of the same that the grade of Myrtle Avenue, from the North curb of Central Avenue to the South curb of First Avenue, be and the same is hereby established as follows, to-wit East Curb Grade.

Beginning at the North curb of Central Avenue, at an elevation of one thousand and twenty eight and six tenths (1028.6) feet; thence ascending for a distance of three hundred and sixteen (316.0) feet, to the South curb of Spring Street, at an elevation of one thousand and thirty one (1031.0) feet; thence ascending for a distance of Eighteen (18.0) feet, to the North curb of said Spring Street, at an elevation of One thousand and

thirty one and four tenths (1031.4) feet; thence ascending for a distance of one hundred and eighty four (184.0) feet to the south curb of Second Avenue, at an elevation of one thousand and forty and three tenths (1040.3) feet; thence ascending for a distance of twenty four (24.0) feet, to the north curb of said Second Avenue, at an elevation of one thousand and forty and ninety four hundredths (1040.94) feet thence ascending for a distance of fifty (50.0) feet to an elevation of one thousand and forty two and one tenth (1042.1) feet; thence descending for a distance of fifty (50.0) feet to an elevation of one thousand and forty one and nine tenths (1041.9) feet; thence descending for a distance of fifty ^(50.0) feet to an

elevation of one thousand and forty one and one tenth (1041.1) feet; thence descending for a distance of fifty (50.0) feet to an elevation of one thousand and forty and one tenth (1040.1) feet thence descending for a distance of two hundred and eighteen (218.0) feet to the south curb of First Avenue at an elevation of one thousand and thirty six and five tenths (1036.5) feet

West curb Grades:--

Beginning at the North curb of Central Avenue at an elevation of one thousand and twenty eight and six tenths (1028.6) feet; thence, ascending for a distance of three hundred and sixteen (316.0) feet to the South curb of Spring Street at an elevation of One thousand thirty two (1032.0) feet; thence, ascending for a distance of Eighteen (18.0) feet, to the North curb of said Spring Street, at an elevation of One thousand and thirty two and four tenths (1032.4) feet; thence, ascending for a distance of One hundred and eighty four (184.0) feet, to the South curb of Second Avenue at an elevation of one thousand and forty one and eight tenths (1041.8) feet; thence, ascending for a distance of twenty four (24.0) feet, to the North curb of said Second Avenue, at an elevation of one thousand and forty two and forty four hundredths (1042.44) feet; thence, ascending for a distance of Fifty (50.0) feet to an


elevation of one thousand and forty three and six tenths (1043.6) feet; thence descending for a distance of Fifty (50.0) feet to an elevation of one thousand and forty three and four tenths (1043.4) feet; thence descending for a distance of Fifty (50.0) feet, to an elevation of one thousand and forty two and six tenths (1042.6) feet thence descending for a distance of Fifty (50.0) feet to an elevation of one thousand and forty one and six tenths (1041.6) feet thence descending for a distance

of Two hundred eighteen (218.0) feet to the South curb of First Avenue at an elevation of one thousand and thirty six and five tenths (1036.5) feet.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with the provisions of this enactment, be and the same are hereby repealed.

And the Borough Engineer is hereby authorized to draft the grade as herein established in the book known as the Borough Grade Book
