

ORDINANCE #95

An Ordinance of the Borough of Patterson Heights, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, prohibiting drivers of vehicles from passing intersections of streets where "Stop" signs are erected without coming to a full stop and providing penalties for the violation thereof.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Patterson Heights, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

Section 1, That stop signs, uniform in appearance with Stop signs used by Pennsylvania State Department of Highways be erected on all streets of said Borough where the said streets enter, Eighth Street, Seventh Street, Sixth Street, Fifth Street and Fourth Street so as to be visible to all vehicles entering or crossing said Eighth Street, Seventh Street, Sixth Street, Fifth Street, and Fourth Street from either side of the same.

Section 2, That no driver of any vehicle of any kind whatsoever shall pass through (an intersection of any of the streets of said Borough) at which a "Stop" sign is erected without first coming to a full stop.

Section 3, Any person, firm or corporation being convicted of the violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance before the Burgess or any Justice of the Peace shall be liable to a fine of \$10.00 for each separate offense, and in default thereof to imprisonment in the Borough Lock-up or County Jail for a period of not more than five days for each dollar fine.
