

**BOROUGH OF PATTERSON HEIGHTS  
EMERGENCY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES  
APRIL 3, 2020**

The purpose of the emergency meeting was to pass a resolution extending the effectiveness of the proclamation of disaster emergency issued by Mayor Ron Tyger on March 27, relating to the coronavirus pandemic and the spread of Covid-19. Notice of this meeting was given on the borough website.

The meeting was called to order by President Bill Starn at 5:00 p.m., and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. Due to concerns over the Covid-19 pandemic, the meeting was held in the parking lot of the Municipal Building. The roll was called.

**Attendance** -- Council Members present included President Bill Starn, Vice-President Jim Turnbull, Bryan Landman, Laura Trehar, Andy Briggs, and Andrew Why. Other officials present were Mayor Ron Tyger, and Secretary/Treasurer Jack Doyle.

**Visitors** – No visitors requested time to speak.

At this time Bryan Landman made a motion to adopt Resolution 20-04-1, entitled, “A resolution of the Council of the Borough of Patterson Heights, County of Beaver, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, extending the effectiveness of the Proclamation of Disaster Emergency issued by the Mayor of the Borough of Patterson Heights on March 27, 2020, relating to the Corona Virus pandemic and spread of Covid-19.” Council members had received copies of the resolution prior to the meeting. The motion was seconded by Andrew Why, and passed unanimously.

**Announcements** – The Borough Secretary told the Council Members that he would be requesting their input prior to the next meeting about Borough operations, and meeting procedures while the Governor’s Declaration remains in effect.

**Adjournment** – At 5:12 Bryan Landman moved that the meeting be adjourned. Andrew Why seconded, and the Council voted in favor. The next regular meeting will be Wednesday, April 15, 2020.
