# A Message from the Fire Chief

Emergency services are continually evolving, with new challenges arising daily that test first responders. These issues are not unique to Patterson Heights but affect departments nationwide. Some common challenges include a lack of manpower, insufficient funding, inadequate training, and aging equipment. To address these issues proactively, the PHVFD is taking steps to ensure we remain a viable organization in the future.

Lack of manpower is perhaps the biggest issue facing the volunteer fire service. We have been fortunate in recent years to recruit new members, but we are always looking for more. Opportunities include Associate Members, Fire Police, Jr. Firefighters (ages 14–17), Non-Suppression Firefighters, and Suppression Firefighters. No previous experience is required. Lack of funding is another significant issue. In many municipalities, fire departments are often an afterthought when it comes to funding. Our department has been very active in applying for state, federal, and private grants. In the past year and a half, we have received grants from The Office of the State Fire Commissioner, the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, The Gary Sinise Foundation, and AEDGrant.com. Last month, we submitted an application for 501(c)(3) (Charitable Organization) status. We are hopeful to receive this designation, which should open up additional funding opportunities for the department.

The Office of the State Fire Commissioner operates a recognition program that acknowledges fire departments at a national level based on their certification levels. This program honors organizations that actively support, promote, and motivate their emergency response personnel to voluntarily obtain certification through the Commonwealth's Certification Program, overseen by the Office of the State Fire Commissioner. We are pleased to announce that this past December, we attained Bronze Level Status, signifying that at least 50% of our members are Pro-Board Firefighter I certified.

EMS resources are stretched thin, creating a stressed system. Like the fire service, this is a nationwide crisis. In the past few months, the PHVFD has been working closely with Borough Council to achieve QRS (Quick Response Service) certification. We have recently purchased a squad (2015 Ford Explorer), and our goal is to certify the squad and one of our engines for QRS. While this is not a replacement for EMS, our goal is to help alleviate some of the burden on local EMS providers and offer the residents of Patterson Heights another level of service. We are looking for people to supplement manpower for QRS who might not be interested in the firefighting side. Those interested in obtaining Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) certification, which requires approximately 56–70 hours of hybrid classroom instruction, should contact Chief Medlin at jmedlinephyfd.org.

We deeply appreciate the support of the residents of Patterson Heights. Your encouragement, participation, and contributions are vital to our success and enable us to continue providing emergency services to our community. Thank you for standing with us as we work to meet these challenges and ensure the safety and well-being of our Borough.

He knew everyone and they knew him. He had a love of God, his family, his country, and many hobbies like going to air shows and collecting trinkets for his garage trivet wall. He is greatly missed by his wife, children, grandchildren, and greats.
