RESOLUTION No. 544-21 1 SUPPORTING THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION 2 3 WHEREAS, Marinette County Board Supervisors are elected to represent the people of Marinette 4 County and are duly sworn by their oath of office to uphold the United States Constitution; and 5 WHEREAS, some Marinette County Citizens have indicated they believe it is important for the 6 County Board to specifically show their support for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment of the United States Constitution; and 8 WHEREAS, a majority of the County Board wishes to not only demonstrate their support for the 9 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment but the entire Constitution and all Amendments; and 10 WHEREAS, the purpose for the adoption of the Constitution is well summarized in the preamble 11 which states "We the People of the United States, in order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, 12 insure domestic Tranquility, provide for common Defense, promote the general Welfare, and secure the 13 blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Prosperity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the 14 United States of America"; and 15 WHEREAS, the United States Constitution adopted in 1787 establishes the basic principles of the 16 legal, political, and economic system; and 17 WHEREAS, in 1791, a list of Ten (10) Amendments consisting of the following: 1st -Freedom of 18 religion, speech, the press, assembly, and the right to petition the government; 2<sup>nd</sup> - Right to keep and 19 bear arms; 3<sup>rd</sup> – Soldiers cannot take or live in a person's house; 4<sup>th</sup> – Government cannot arrest a person 20 or search a person's property unless there is *probable cause*; 5<sup>th</sup> – Government must follow the law (due 21 process) before punishing a person;  $6^{th}$  – Person has a right to a fair and speedy trial by Jury;  $7^{th}$  – Person 22 has a right to a Jury trial for civil cases; 8<sup>th</sup> – Government cannot demand excessive bail or fines, or cruel 23 and unusual punishment; 9<sup>th</sup> – Constitution does not include all the rights of the people and the states; and 24 10<sup>th</sup> – Any power the Constitution does not give to the Federal Government belongs to the states, were 25 added and are referred to as the Bill of Rights and over the years additional amendments were added; and 26 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Marinette County Board of Supervisors supports 27 the Constitution and all 27 Amendments and strongly opposes any modifications to the Bill of Rights and 28 further opposes any special legislation that would infringe on those rights; and 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Marinette County Board directs the County Clerk to distribute 30 copies of this resolution to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin and the State and Federal 31 Representatives elected to represent the citizens of Marinette County. 32 33 Adopted this 25<sup>th</sup> day of January 2022, by a majority vote of a quorum of the Marinette County Board. 34 35 36 37 Kathy Brandt, County Clerk John Guarisco, Chairperson 38 39 40
