The central theme for our department this year will be Training, Communication, and following the National Bylaws. My team and I have been working very hard with the National Line Officers and National Accounting team to revamp our Dept. Budget and Financials, the forms we use in all levels of the auxiliaries, and how our Dept. communications hierarchy should operate.

The Dept. Budget has a new look and is easier to read. A Dept. Financial Report has been created that lines up with the Budget to track expenditures. We will be creating An Accountability Plan that will outline what is an allowable expenditure or reimbursement for all our volunteers, per IRS Guidelines. We must operate within Federal Laws as a Non-Profit Organization. Every Auxiliary member should know what funds the Dept. has and how we are spending them. It is your Membership Dues, Obligations, and fundraising that helps us to operate on your behalf!

My team has revamped and simplied some of the forms we use for all Auxiliary Officers and recordkeeping. The language and format is easier for members to use and understand. You can now download these forms from the Dept. Website. The Website will be our central hub of communication within all levels of our Auxiliaries. The new format we created for the Dept. Roster is now be easier to read, print and update. We will send out emails as contact changes are sent to us so only certain pages will need to be printed. The Silver Notes Newsletter was set up online to be more informative for all our members, and we will email a copy to all Auxiliary Presidents. The Calendar on the website has been preloaded with all auxiliary meetings and some events for the year through June 2023. We have created a video tutorial for the website and will hold live tutorials at District and Auxiliary meetings if requested.

Please fill out my Official Visit form so I may schedule my visit to your Auxiliary. I want to understand what each auxiliary may need, or want assistance with, so my team may assist you. Do you need help working the programs, creating an agenda for a meeting, helping veterans, or fundraising? We are here to help! Also, send in your event flyers to the Dept. Secretary so we can post them on the Dept. Website and get the word out to members so they may attend.

This year is going to fly by quickly! I strongly encourage all Auxiliary and Department Line Officers to communicate and work with each other in order to avoid misinformation or confusion in directives. The National Bylaws outline how we should interact with each other and do our duties. We need to eliminate the 'We've always done it this way" mentality. A good rule of thumb is: If a National Line Officer, a Dept. Secretary, or a Dept. President didn't send it out via an email or a phone call, then it wasn't approved to be communicated to the Auxiliaries or Membership.

I have an open-door policy and will keep confidential information where it belongs. Please call or email me directly and we will create positive solutions together! I look forward to us all working together and supporting each other as we take care of our Veterans. If we are organized and cohesive, we will do great things in our communities!

POW/MIA Remembrance Day Friday September 16, 2022

American POW Numbers:

130,201 World War II service members were imprisoned; 14,072 them died.

7,140 Korean War service members were imprisoned; 2,701 of them died.

725 Vietnam War service members were imprisoned; 64 of them died.

37 service members were imprisoned during conflicts since 1991, including both Gulf wars; none is still in captivity

American MIA Numbers:

73,515 from World War II (an approximate number due to limited or conflicting data)

7,841 from the Korean War

1,626 from Vietnam

126 from the Cold War

6 from conflicts since 1991

75% of those missing Americans are somewhere in the Asia-Pacific. More than 41,000 have been presumed lost at sea.

With great pride, I am pleased to share information from the passage of the PACT Act. It is so wonderful that our veterans who suffered from toxic exposure at Camp Lejeune will receive help. I have been asked by **Dan West**, Adjutant General, and Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States to share this information with the Nevada Auxiliaries in the hope that you will share with all your members and veterans that you know. This is truly a great Legislative Action.

- With the passage of the PACT Act, you may be seeing an increase in ads popping up
 for Marines who served at Camp Lejeune to participate in the lawsuits authorized
 under the <u>Camp Lejeune Justice Act portion of PACT (Section 804)</u>. While these
 lawsuits will finally offer closure to many, here is what you need to know <u>today</u> and
 what we ask you share with members and veterans in your state who have guestions:
- Veterans who think they may qualify for a presumptive benefit under the PACT Act, or who may think they qualify for a Camp Lejeune lawsuit should call their accredited VFW service officer FIRST.
- The PACT Act offers care and benefits to generations of veterans, but no one can tell you today exactly how VA will interpret the 150 pages of legislation until VA publishes regulations in the coming months. This is why working with an accredited service officer who knows federal regulations is so important.
- ¹While the Camp Lejeune lawsuits stand to help scores of family members and contractors who were on Camp Lejeune, veterans who participate in the lawsuits may stand to forfeit other service-connected benefits from Camp Lejeune toxic exposure and other qualifying military service.
- While family members and contractors may wish to consult with an attorney on Camp Lejeune, veterans should seek out their free VA service-connected benefits first.
- Filing a VA claim for service-connected benefits with the VFW is always free and VFW's accredited service officers can be found at <u>www.vfw.org/NVS.</u>

"Missing Man" Table

The POW/MIA Missing Man Table ceremony is a dignified and solemn moment in many formal dinners and other occasions. It involves a table, usually set off to the side, with a single chair. The table is set with a white tablecloth, a single candle, a book of faith (optional), an inverted glass, and a single red rose in a vase, around which is tied a yellow ribbon. Set at the table is a plate containing a slice of lemon and a small amount of salt. There is nothing more poignant than witnessing the empty chair sitting at a POW/MIA table with incredible significance for every displayed feature of this ritual. Witnessing the ceremony that accompanies this memorable event brings more than just a single emotion. The ceremony is performed many times, throughout the year, at official military events in remembrance and in honor of all POW/MIAs.

Pups, Prisoners & Patriots

Those Left Behind, a Las Vegas nonprofit, runs Pups, Prisoners & Patriots. Volunteers find homes for shelter dogs, giving them a second chance at life. First the dogs undergo 12 to 16 weeks of specialized training from handlers that live at Lovelock Correctional Center. This program is run by Maria Ward, a Gold Star Mother. With the assistance of Senior Officers, Ward supervises 168 men. Some of the men participate in the Structured Living Program, a military – style boot camp. Others train dogs for Pups, Prisoners & Patriots. Every six to eight weeks new dogs go to the unit, and they pick up canine graduates. They find homes for the dogs with Veterans, First Responders and people with disabilities. Since inception the program has place 76 dogs. Donations can be mailed to the local address on the flyer, or for more information visit their Facebook Page or website, TLBfoundation.org.

Together With Veterans (TWV) is a Veteranled community based suicide prevention program. TWV teams conduct a public health action planning process to address rural Veteran suicide prevention.
