Debbie Wiseman

An award-winning composer of music for stage and screen, Debbie Wiseman’s music is distinguished by its ability to capture emotion and character in an instant. In addition to more than 200 credits for film and television and concert works for audiences of all ages, she has composed music for royal occasions and in her capacity as Composer in Residence at Classic FM. Debbie has been nominated for two Ivor Novello Awards, for Wilde and Death of Yugoslavia, she was awarded the Best Composer, Drama award for Wolf Hall at the RTS West Awards.



Roxanna Panufnik

She is probably best-known for her ‘Coronation Sanctus’ commissioned by King Charles III for his Coronation service. Thanks to her hybrid heritage, she has a great love of music from a variety of cultures and different faiths. Her mission to build musical bridges between the three Abrahamic faiths has resulted in commissions from The World Orchestra for Peace in Jerusalem and the BBC Proms. In 2023 she was awarded a Coronation Medal by the UK Nation for her services to the Coronation. In 2024 Roxanna received the Ivor Novello Award for Outstanding Works Collection.



Dr. Leah Broad

Is a multi-award-winning writer, historian and public speaker. Her first book ‘Quartet’ is an authoritative and alarming account of how women have been discouraged, ignored or deliberately written out of the canon of classical music. Through the lives of four composers – Ethel Smyth, Rebecca Clarke, Dorothy Howell and Doreen Carwithen - we can see how the recent growing acceptance of female composers owes so much to these ‘extraordinary women who forged careers in music through passion and determination’ (Debbie Wiseman).



Marina Solarek

Studied violin, piano and conducting in Mannheim and Hamburg and completed her violin studies in London with Prof Yfrah Neamen. She has performed regularly in Britain and abroad with her Solarek Piano Trio which has been specialising in the performance of works by neglected women composers of the 18th, 19th and 20th Century. Marina has given concerts at the South Bank and has made several broadcasts for Classic FM and BBC Radio 3. She has recently given the first performance of the Violin concerto by Henriette Bosmans with the Richmond Orchestra. Marina is Artistic Director of the Youth Music Centre in North West London. She has taught at the Royal College Junior Department, has coached on many residential chamber courses, conducts amateur orchestras and has given Masterclasses at the University of Belfast.



Twickenham Choral



With a long and illustrious history – celebrating its Centenary in 2022 – Twickenham Choral is one of the foremost choirs in West London. Over the years, the choir has sung all the great works from the choral repertoire and also explored less familiar music, ranging from Renaissance to the present day, including several commissioned works, of which Wild Musick is a wonderful example. Conductor Howard Ionascu leads a dynamic and challenging rehearsal schedule, bringing enormous enthusiasm and a focus on excellence to this ever-ambitious choir. 




