In the past, Arts Richmond has organised an Affordable Art Tent at the Richmond May Fair. However times have changed and the pandemic has meant that the Richmond May Fair has not happened for a few years.

However, we at Arts Richmond still wish to support our artist communities, especially as they have not been able to exhibit until recently. We organised a Teddington Art Trail which allowed local artists to show their work in the independent shops in Teddington.

But we still wish to do more. We have hired a space at the St Margaret's Fair which will be held on Saturday 2 July on Moormead, Moormead Road, St Margaret's, Twickenham, TW1 1 JS.

Unfortunately we will have a much smaller sales area than we have had previously however we have heard that the St Margaret's Fair is well-attended so there should be a really good footfall. We hope this will mean lots of sales.

- 4) Collections of unsold artworks will be from Monday 4 July from 9.30am until 12.30pm. Payments for artworks sold will be processed the week commencing Monday 4 July


