The annual summer jaunt by Arts Richmond to the Chichester Theatre for a topping musical was a huge success. We enjoyed a lovely drive down on a bright sunny day and were delighted to find we had wonderful seats with great sightlines set about this huge and impressive theatre

We none of us expected Fred Astaire but the musical version of "Top Hat" is as lively and beautiful to look at as you could hope. This version has been adapted from the well-loved film but the plot with its misunderstandings, mistaken identities and even the jolly jokes isn't the point here - this is after all a musical - music, singing and dancing are the stars.

I just love tap dancing and was mesmerised by the incredibly speedy twinkling toes performing to some great music. Their version of "Putting on the Ritz" with the chaps in oh-so-smart black and white dinner gear and their gorgeous partners in fabulous frocks was almost worth the journey on its own.

There are so many wonderful numbers but one of the highlights for me was the couple performing "Dancing in the Dark" which was just so beautiful and so romantic it was sheer delight.

The Beach gallery in Teddington will play host to an exhibition of works exploring and celebrating the theme of 'Female Resilience' this September.

Although Touchlines of Fortitude has been partly inspired by the 2025 Women's Rugby World Cup, it will take a much broader look at female strength in all its forms, and the many ways in which women rise, persist, endure and transform.






