

REOPENING OF SANFORD CAMP DURING COVID 2021 SEASON

GENERAL GUIDANCE

Camp Season: June 14 to August 20 (10 weeks)

Groups: Maximum of 15 per group; groups will not mix; each group has its own homeroom in the middle school building; these homerooms can be used during inclement weather.

Social Distancing: 3 to 6 feet social distancing will be followed; camp capacity will be reduced to ensure social distancing.

Temperature Scan: All campers and staff will have their temperature taken before entering the camp. Anyone showing a temperature higher than 100.1 F will be sent home immediately. Parents will not be allowed to send sick children to camp.

Masks: All staff members will be required to wear masks. All individuals from kindergarten to adults will be required to wear masks when indoors and outdoors. This includes parents dropping off/picking up campers.

Exceptions are as follows:

- a) when eating or drinking at a lunch or snack table
- b) when swimming in the pool
- c) during vigorous physical activity when the 3 to 6 feet separation can be achieved as determined by the counselor or activities director

Swim: Each group will be given 1 swim period per day. Lessons will be given to younger groups twice a week.

Specialty/Sports Camps: Any specialty camp with an enrollment of under 10 campers will be cancelled. Maximum enrollment will be cut at 15 campers.

North Wilmington: Lehanes Bus Service will provide sanitized busses every morning and campers will be seated every other seat with siblings sitting in the same seat.

**IMPORTANT NOTE REGARDING DROP IN REGISTRATIONS
DUE TO THE CRITICAL IMPORTANCE OF SPECIAL COVID PRECAUTIONS**

Campers must be pre-registered for any and all services offered by Sanford Day Camps. *The camp will no longer be able to accept 'drop in' campers.* You must be registered at least a week in advance of your child's first week at camp and all forms must be received no later than the Wednesday of the week prior to your child's first week at camp.

Extended Care will no longer accept 'drop in' campers. Registered campers must be additionally registered for extended care at least a week in advance of your need for any extended care service offered by Sanford Day Camps.

CAMPER ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE PROCEDURES

A rectangular table will be placed a minimum of 6 feet from the door. Parents and Guardians will bring their children to the table to sign in and have the child's temperature assessed. A CIT or counselor will walk the children to their assigned classrooms. Parents and Guardians will not be permitted to walk their children to the classrooms.

Sanford Camp Extended Day Arrival Procedures

A rectangular table will be placed a minimum of 6 feet from the door. Parents and Guardians will bring their children to the table to sign in and have the child's temperature assessed. Parents and Guardians will not be permitted to walk their children to the classrooms. Morning care counselors will sanitize the morning care classrooms and toys. *** There will be NO last minute drop-ins permitted due to the demands of maintaining social distancing, staff mandates, and sanitization procedures.*

Sanford Camp Extended Day Dismissal Procedures

**** Aftercare Counselors will report to the nurse or Extended Care Director to have their temperature assessed upon arrival. Counselors will sanitize the area after snack. A rectangular table will be placed a minimum of 6 feet from the door. Parents and guardians will come to the table to sign out their children. Parents and Guardians will not be permitted to walk to the classrooms. At the end of the shift, counselors will sanitize classroom areas and toys. ** *There will be NO last minute drop-ins permitted due to the demands of maintaining social distancing, staff mandates, and sanitization procedures.*

HANDWASHING AND FACE COVERINGS

All individuals from kindergarten to adults will be required to wear masks when indoors and outdoors. Exceptions are as follows:

- when eating or drinking at a lunch or snack table;
- when swimming in the pool;
- during vigorous physical activity when the 3 to 6 feet separation can be achieved as determined by the counselor or activities director.

Counselors will carry spray bottles filled with hand sanitizer. Hands of campers will be sprayed between activities.

CLEANING

At the end of each day professional cleaners will sanitize the buildings and equipment. During the day, camp staff will sanitize bathrooms, surfaces, and equipment twice during the day using EPA approved disinfectants.

EMPLOYEE AND CAMPER SCREENING

Temperatures of staff and campers will be carried out each day. The procedure has been outlined in a previous section.

NOTIFICATION OF PARENTS

All parents will receive a notice of these practices before the camp season starts. Parents will be directed not to send sick children to camp.

CAMP NURSE

The camp will employ a nurse or medical specialist to oversee the carryout of these guidelines. Parents will be able to speak with the nurse or medical specialist regarding any of these protocols, or, for any other medical issues relating to their child(ren).
