Drift Event Drivers Rule Sheet

1. Eligibility and Registration

- All drivers must possess a valid driver's license.
- Drivers must sign a liability waiver prior to participation.
- Entry fees must be paid in full to compete.
- All drivers must attend the driver's safety meeting or get the safety briefing from the event host before entering the track.
- All drivers must wear wristbands on their left wrist. Failure to comply will result in removal from the track. If the wristband is damaged, it can be brought to the ticket office for replacement. If you cannot provide proof of a wristband, you will have to purchase a new wristband at full price.
- Individuals not registered as drivers are considered spectators (subject to spectator rules).
- No minor passengers are permitted with a minor driver.

2. Vehicle Requirements

- All vehicles must pass a technical inspection before entering the track.
- Convertibles must have adequate roll-over protection or aftermarket roll bar/cage.
- Battery must be securely mounted.
- No fluid leaks allowed (oil, fuel, coolant). Must have a securely mounted coolant overflow.
- Seat and harness must be securely mounted.

3. Safety Equipment

- Drivers must wear a DOT-approved helmet with a Double D-ring retention system while on the track or skid pad.
- Shoes and long pants are mandatory. No sandals or shorts to be worn on the racing surfaces.
- Harness or seat belts must be worn at all times while on the track or skid pad.
- All participating vehicles must have a securely mounted (no zip ties, wire, or hose clamps) ABC fire extinguisher within reach of the driver, which can be easily removed.

4. Conduct and Behavior

- Drugs or alcohol use is prohibited when operating any motor vehicle.
- Zero tolerance for drugs or alcohol use during operation hours.

- No aggressive or unsafe driving off-course.
- All attendees must conduct themselves respectfully. Rudeness towards staff will not be tolerated.
- Respect the venue by disposing of garbage appropriately. Car parts, tires, pop-ups, and other non-household garbage cannot be left at the track.
- Drivers are responsible for their guests and crew. Any strikes applied to your guest, are also strikes against you as the driver.
- Reno Fernley Raceway has a 3-strike rule for anyone who does not abide by these rules. Depending on the severity of the issue, immediate removal from the event can occur.

5. Track Rules

- Follow all instructions from Safety Stewards and flaggers.
- Drivers must not enter the track until signaled to do so.
- Drivers should not leave their vehicle unless it is on fire.
- If a support/service vehicle is out on the track, the event will be halted until the driver exits the track or Safety Steward deems it safe for operation.
- Spun out or stuck cars are treated as a yellow flag. Other vehicles must slow down and maneuver around the stopped vehicle in a safe manor.
- Only one Tandem group is allowed at a time.
- No burnouts or drifting in the paddock or staging area.
- Speed limit in pits/paddock is limited to 5mph.
- Pit bikes are for transportation only. No wheelies, burnouts, doughnuts, or racing pit bikes allowed.
- Any motorized vehicle must obey any DOT rules & regulations. This includes quads, SXS, pit bikes, and motorcycles. Must possess a state driver's license while operating on the RFR property. No underage drivers/riders.
- Exit the course safely after completing runs. Speed after finish line is limited to 25-30mph. No racing in the cool down area. The cool down area is the area between the finish line and the track exit.
- No driving in the opposite direction on the track at any time!!
