## WAIMEA RESILIENCE HUB

The **Waimea Resilience Hub** was founded in the belief that a community can be more resilient in responding to natural and other disasters – and to inequities and inevitable change - when residents become more connected, collaborative, and prepared.

**Disasters** such as pandemics, hurricanes, or wildfires highlight and exacerbate inequities in a community but the need for community connection and cohesiveness is 24/7 - 365 days a year to address gaps in services or resources and build equity, resilience, and self-reliance.

Our hub intends to **collaborate** with existing organizations and programs which are already doing valuable work, strengthen relationships between government and communities served, shift responsibility to local residents to identify and drive solutions, and, longer term, help address deep-rooted inequities that harm community well-being.
