About the Journal: Scope and Focus

The PHAVISMINDA Journal is the Journal of the Philosophical Association of the Visayas and Mindanao. It is committed to the promotion of the study of philosophy specifically in the following fields or areas:

- Contemporary Continental Philosophy
- Contemporary Analytic Philosophy
- Enduring Themes in Metaphysics, Epistemology and Theodicy
- Oriental Thought
- Philosophy's intersection with the Sciences: Natural and Social
- Enduring and Emerging Issues in Social Ethics and Bioethics
- The study of Philosophy in the Philippines

Guidelines for the Contributors

1. Preliminary Considerations

Interested contributors should consider the journal's thrust before submitting. Consideration of submitted manuscripts shall be based on its alignment to the journal's scope and focus.

2. Publication Ethics

Contributors are expected to follow the general principles of academic integrity, thus it is expected that:

- the manuscript submitted to Phavisminda Journal was not submitted or is not being considered in any other journal/s;
- permission to use copyrighted materials is obtained by the author, and
- all cited sources are acknowledged or documented in the article.

3. Publishable Works and Length

Works that are published in the journal are generally classified into three types:

- Featured, i.e. 8,000-10,000 words
- Articles (for peer review), i.e. 7,000 to 8,000 words
- Book Reviews (books published in the last 3 years), i.e. 1,500 to 2,000 words

4. Electronic Submission

Manuscripts must be submitted electronically to the editor-in-chief. Three files must be submitted: (1) author's details including the full name, current position or appointment and institutional affiliation, (2) Abstract of not more than 300 words inclusive of the main thesis, objectives, methods and/or framework, with 3-5 keywords; this must be without the author's name, and (3) the full article without the author's name. 5. Language Conventions

American English must be used. Generally accepted conventions on spelling, grammar, and punctuations must be followed.

6. Format

MS Word (.docx) or rich text format (.rtf) must be used.

7. Documentation

Footnotes must be used following the Turabian or Chicago Manual Style. Bibliography must be provided at the end of the article.
