

## **GUIDE FOR AUTHORS**

**(Revised for the Next Issue)**

1. Manuscripts for consideration must advance knowledge in a specific discipline in philosophy in terms of new methodologies, concepts, or theories. They must not have been submitted or is not being considered in any other journals. Article manuscripts must contain at least 5000-10000 words. Book reviews must have a minimum of 1500 words.

2. Electronic submissions are preferred. Two files must be submitted: one, the whole manuscript which includes the 150-300-word abstract and 3-5 keywords but without the author's name on it; and two, the author's data, occupational affiliation, correspondence details (or this information can be written in the email message). ### 3. Language

The structure and language of the paper must be formal. The paper must be free from the language used in oral presentation.

### 4. Format of Texts

The PHAVISMINDA Journal only accepts submissions in Word (.docx), .rtf (rich text file), or open office file formats.

### 5. On typing the manuscript

After each period, use only one space. Word processors have automatic spacing of characters, so two spaces, after the period or colon, are no longer necessary.

Use the "References" or "Endnote" functions of the word processor.

Always use a tab for paragraph indents.

When the manuscript is received, the author will be notified acknowledging the receipt of the manuscripts. Please allow at least two months for review purposes.

For the next issue, this journal will follow the Turabian Style of documentation, that is, endnotes and bibliographic format.

The criteria for assessing articles are: originality, presentation, organization, soundness of arguments, or philosophical interest to the readers.

## 6. Sample Documentation Style

Authors must be responsible for the accuracy of their references. For specific citations, the author must use endnotes (N) numbered in Roman Numerals. The list of cited works will be Bibliography (B) and it will be arranged: Books, Periodicals, Electronic Sources, and Unpublished Materials (if any).

### Books

Citation to the same source immediately preceding the following main citation:

Later citation of the same source:

### Periodicals or Articles in a Journal
