This year the Mothership has become SkullyFest - same purpose, same excitement just a new name and some new FUN



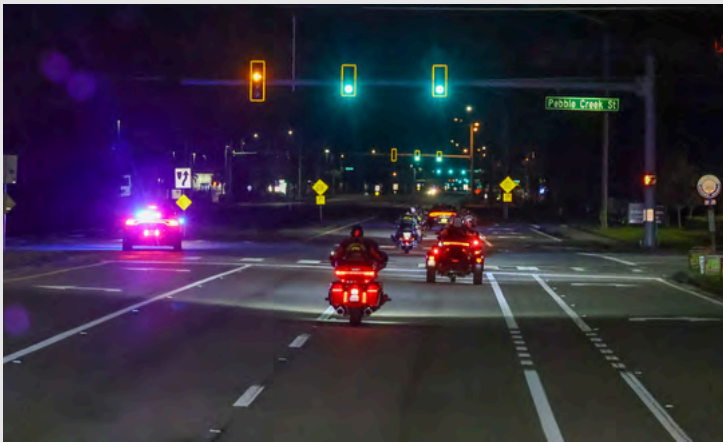
# FL 20-1

Obituary for SFC Kevin Kyle Gray - Sergeant First Class Kevin Kyle Gray, 58 yrs old, fought his last battle on November 23, 2024, at 10:36 am surrounded by friends and family. Kevin was born in Moline, IL on August 25, 1966, to the late Jerry Gray and Denise Fenton. Kevin joined the Army in 1984 at 17 years old and was a decorated officer and a distinguished veteran. He served in Desert Storm, Bosnia, and Iraq. He was a Chief on a Blackhawk Medevac helicopter and was awarded the bronze star for unparalleled bravery. He was a master drill sergeant and was awarded drill sergeant of the year. His Decorations, Medals, Badges, Citations, and Campaign Ribbons awarded are too many to list. He served 21 years in the military. Kevin earned his spot at Arlington National Cemetery for his bravery and valor.

Kevin is survived by his daughter Kassie, and three grandchildren, Maddox, Maddie, and, Makenna, who knew him as Grandpa. Also survived by his Mom, Carole Gray and four brothers, Aaron Gray, Jeff Gray, Matt Anderson, and Shane Anderson. And several nieces and nephews.

Kevin enjoyed spending time with his brothers and sisters in the Combat Vets Motorcycle Organization and was known in the organization as "Battle". JC, Chef D, Gunner, Comms, Top Shelf, Heavy D, Chaos, and many others were a significant part of his life. He also found a home in Odell's Saloon and found many friends and enjoyed shooting pool and visiting with all. He often made the comment that he "found family" in the folks at Odell's.

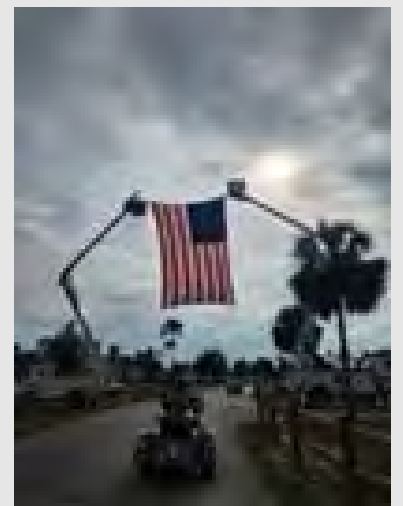
## AN ESCORTED RIDE

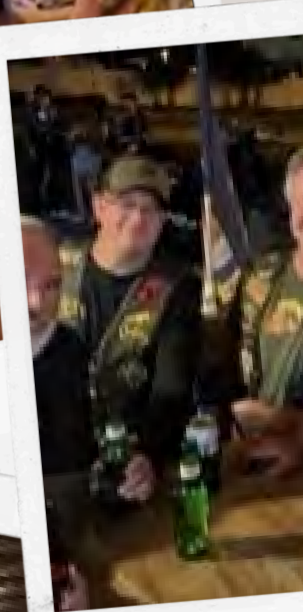
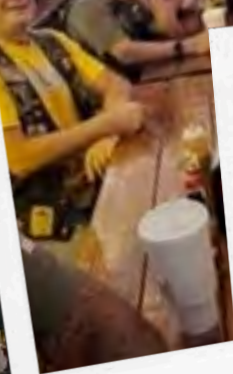

Operation Coldfront started in 2017 after a local homeless vet “sprite mike“ died of exposure. As a joint effort with FL 20-3 cold weather donations are collected and donated to local shelters.



Mr Jerry moved on from this world to reunite with his wife, son, and grandson in the morning hours of, 1 December with his CVMA family by his side.

He was put in our paths for reasons we are still working through to understand, but at the heart of it.... Everyone who stepped to the plate in any way picked up Mr Jerry as both a veteran and a member of our family. We collectively did everything within our power to restore his faith, hope, security, comfort, love, pride, dignity. We worked genuinely and selflessly make his final days the best they could possibly be in the time we had.

We were alerted by a friend and member of another local area 501C organization that an aged veteran was living in a severe state of squalor, no running water (for more than a year and a half) and he is not enrolled for or receiving much-needed VA benefits yet.

He'd basically given up.

This veteran also had some serious medical issues that had complicated his life and ability to live or function comfortably and safely until.

Working jointly to restore his home to a habitable and safe condition with all necessary working utilities, We were able to get him enrolled for VA benefits

Rest in Peace, Mr. Jerry, we'll take it from here!

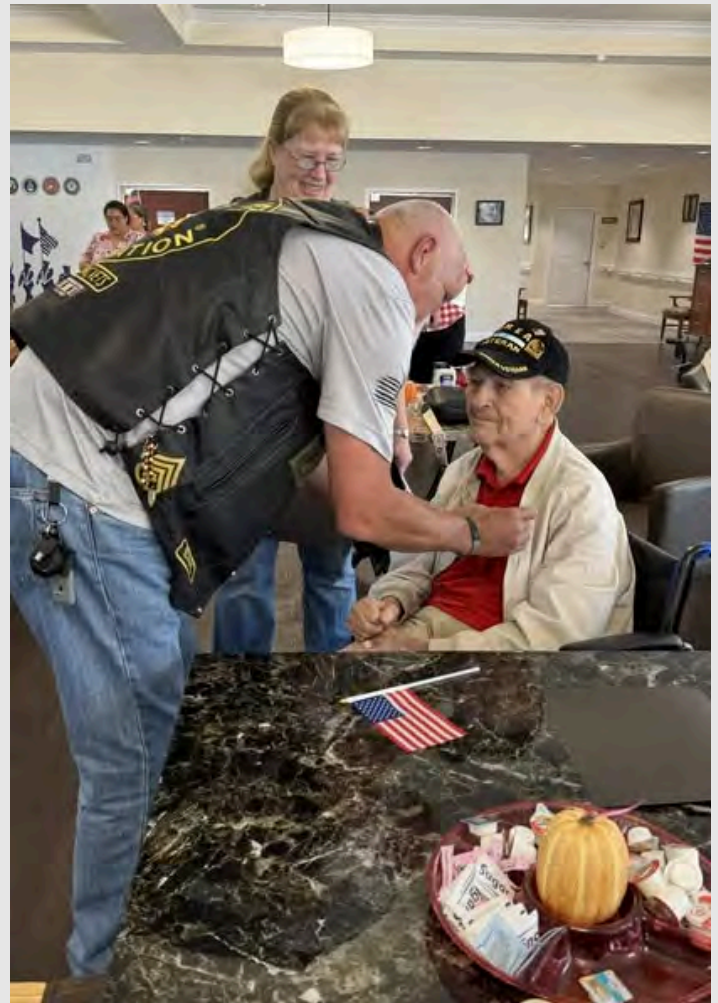

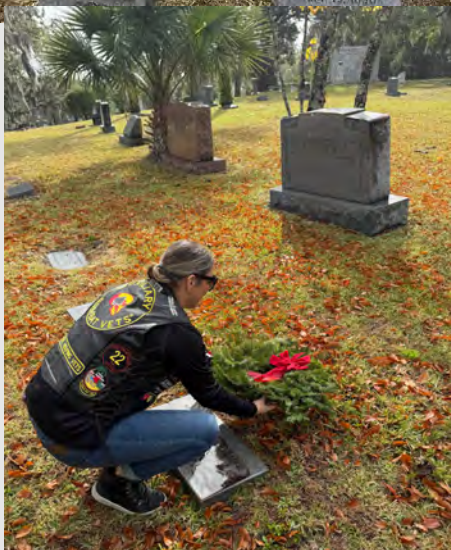
