LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

To: Gary Giacomini, Marin County Board of Supervisors Dear Gary:

This letter is in response to the recent actions taken by the Marin County Supervisors regarding our Public Safety and specifically the actions taken that affect our Throckmorton Ridge Fire Station.

In short we are frustrated and angry.

Our frustration centers around several factors-

- 1. We were told no vote would be taken at the June 4 meeting, but that we would be permitted to present our data for your review for future action. It became clear that decisions were already agreed to our presentations were irrelevant.
- 2. The group of 200 or so that were at the June 4 meeting were "used" to address Senator Marks and Assemblywoman Bronschvag. We seemed to be a ploy used by the Supervisors to shift focus from the county to the state. While we realize that indeed "the State" is a culprit in this financial mess, we hold you accountable. You are our elected official. You are our voice and your actions are most important to us. You said that you supported our efforts and the "no change" policy for our fire station. We're frustrated at the turn of events and ask for an explanation.

While it is encouraging that reinstating our Throckmorton Ridge Station to its existing status is the County's first priority if added funds are available, we have no guarantees - and if we did, could we believe them?

But, most of all, we are angry.

The anger comes from the fact that we face the closure of our fire station during the non-fire season and a reduced staff during the fire season. This is total insanity. To put Mt. Tam, its residents, and the millions of tourists in potential jeopardy is unconscionable.

You said it best when you said "It will mean people will die." Our previous correspondence indicated the importance of our fire station to the Mountain. It serves not only our community, but visitors to Mt. Tamalpais State Park, GGNRA lands, Muir Woods

National Monument, Muir Beach, Stinson Beach, MMWD open lands and other recreational areas. The station is THE first line of fire defense and vital paramedic services, handling the accidents and medical needs of all who travel to the parks and beaches. Take away our station and you increase response time drastically, and increase the risk of people dying – as you so aptly stated.

Several added factors that have been advanced as solutions should be addressed...

A parcel tax assessment and a Volunteer Fire brigade/auxiliary are band-aids. They cover up the basic problems, may indeed create more problems and set a precedent for "easy-money". The taxes we pay should stay here, work for us and protect us. We've taken a straw-poll of our members and there is strong feeling against any additional assessment. (If the County or State think about diverting our monies, maybe we should think about keeping our taxes for our specific community needs.)

At a meeting of our Association last night, we felt more dedicated than ever to champion our cause. Our "Save Mt. Tam" committee plans to do anything to keep our Throckmorton Ridge Station open. We're continuing our petition drive; planning parades and events; developing public service TV and radio commercials; expanding our letter/fax support efforts and applying added pressure to install our first alert Radio Communications system.

Gary, we realize the tough position the County is in. However, when we see administration budgets increasing, questionable

priorities being established, and internal bureaucracy squabbles, is it any wonder we feel the way we do? We further realize that the State is a major part of the problem, and we'll do all we can to do battle with them. But our first battle is with the County - and you are our elected representative. You're accountable and our lives may well be in your hands.

I'll call you early in the week to set an appointment to discuss this further.

JUNE 2ND BOARD MEETING REPORT

Dick Popson and Jim Campbell reported on their meetings with Fire Chief Rowan and Supervisor Gary Giacomini about the proposed budget cuts and problems with getting the AM Emergency Radio Station in place.

Most of the meeting was spent discussing and planning what was to be done prior to and during the Board of Supervisors Hearing on the proposed budget cuts.

It was pointed out that the amount needed to keep our station open was somewhere around \$150,000 (later updated to \$183,000) and that \$500,000 was needed to keep the County's safety services at its present level.

The Save Mt. Tam T-shirts were made available for sale at \$15.00 each. The money will go to support the cost of our efforts to save our Fire and Paramedic services.

The June 5th chipper day activities were discussed and copies of the permit to cut on the Panoramic right-of-way and on adjacent State Park property were passed out with instructions on clearing.


