AM RADIO STATION FREQUENCY CHANGED — AGAIN!

If you didn't see the article in the Mill Valley Herald about the installation of the AM Emergency Radio Station at Throckmorton Ridge, you might not know that they still haven't nailed down the permit from the FCC on which frequency will be given to us. The latest frequency proposed is 1280 AM. The emergency preparedness books (the red ones) being distributed show the frequency to be 530 AM. We will mail stickers to all residents when the FCC permit is signed, sealed and delivered and we know just which frequency the radio station will be using.

SIREN COVERAGE INADEQUATE — NEW SIREN SLATED FOR MWPCA PROPERTY ON RIDGE

A number of residents have complained that they either can't hear the siren at all or can barely hear it. Our siren is an old World War II bomb raid siren — it's not one of the new "screamers" that can be heard for miles. Consequently we need to get an additional siren to give us the coverage we need, which is mostly the Ridge Ave. area and near Four Corners.

BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Firebreaks along Panoramic and between Mt. Tam and Mill Valley were discussed at the Firesafe Marin July 29th meeting. We also presented our request for restoration of the old "Smokey the Bear" Fire Danger sign at 4 corners. It became apparent that Firesafe Marin can't do anything. They are principally concerned with becoming a non-profit entity that can get grants. However, it is a good effort to build interagency communication.

The costs and feasibility of trimming and/or cutting trees on MWPCA property was discussed. Bob Rydjord will go over the property with fire dept. personnel in an effort to set priorities about trimming and cutting.

A Nominating Committee was formed with Robert. Rydjord, Randy Barrow and Del Goetz. They will meet to determine a possible slate of board members and report back to the Sept, board meeting.

There was discussion of recent burglaries and thefts on the Mountain and what might be done to increase resident awareness of security measures.

NEW SIGN INDICATING FIRE DANGER LEVEL OK'd FOR 4 CORNERS

Discussions with Mt. Tam State Park's Chief Ranger, Ron Angier, and Captain Frank Neer of the County Fire Dept. have resulted in plans for a fire danger sign to be put up where the old "Smokey the Bear" fire safety sign used to be at Four Corners. Much of the material will be donated by the State Park. We're looking for a volunteer who's had experience in making routed or sandblasted signs. We have routing equipment but need a portable sand blasting unit we could borrow for a weekend.

The sign will be a basic dial indicating whether fire conditions are low, moderate, high or severe danger. It will also indicate when the Park and public open space areas are closed due to severe fire hazard.

CARTER COMPTON COLLINS, Ph.D.

Carter Collins, 69, died of a sudden heart attack on Aug. 17 at his home on Ridge Ave. Associates said he was at work doing research on his home computer when he had the heart attack.

A former Navy test pilot, Mr. Collins earned advance degrees in engineering and biophysics from U. C. Berkeley. He worked with W. Von Braun in the rocket research technological sprint following the Sputnik launch. During his multidisciplined career, he produced over 150 publications and held multiple patents.

Surviving are his wife Patricia and his two children, Carter Compton Collins III, and Diana Reeves Collins.



FROM THE PRESIDENT

Our community lost one of its most talented citizens when Carter Collins died. He called his doctor to say he felt bad and collapsed while on the phone. The doctor called his office—he wasn't there; called his home and got a busy signal; then called 911. We'll never know if the new type of defibrillator could have saved his life, because our Fire Dept. wasn't equipped with one.

But, Carter Collins' family is seeing to it that future 911 callers will have that piece of equipment available to them. The family has asked that friends and relatives send memorial donations to the Bank of Marin Defibrillator Fund for the Throckmorton Ridge Fire Station. Funds should be mailed to Bank of Marin at 50 Madera Blvd. in Corte Madera, CA 94925. Even if you didn't know Carter, you might want to send some money. You or yours may benefit from having this piece of equipment available to us on the Mountain.

Safety is our most important issue. That is why we have worked so hard to put a good disaster plan in place and get you involved. Let's face it, we are remote. The ambulance is 20, maybe 30 minutes (if

traffic is clogging Panoramic) away. Our lives rest with the skills of our Fire Dept. EMT personnel and our nearest neighbors. We must get to know our neighbors and work with them to improve the safety communications in our neighborhood.

Our Emergency AM Radio Station is soon to be realized — after 2 plus years and 3 changes in frequency. The latest is 1280 AM. But several residents have called me to inquire about being able to hear the siren so they know to tune to the safety station for information. It's true; we have some dead spots on the ridge where the Throckmorton Ridge Fire Siren cannot be heard. Consequently our goal is to install one of the new "screamer" sirens on the west side of the ridge at its mid-point — which just happens to be on MWPCA property.

October is the fundraiser month. If you have something you can donate for our silent auction or a door prize, please get in touch with Keith Papulias at 388-9219, or fill in the enclosed sheet and return it to us. And, please buy tickets for the Oktoberfest. Half of the price of the ticket goes towards the new siren.


